5234 High School (Secondary) Articulation *

Chabot-Las Positas Community College District recognizes the value of coursework completed at the secondary level and that in some cases secondary level courses are comparable to specific community college courses. The term “articulated high school (secondary) course” means a high school course or courses that the college faculty in the appropriate discipline, using policies and procedures approved by the curriculum committee, have determined to be comparable to a specific community college course. Students can use such coursework to meet major and program requirements, but will not receive college credit for the course, except through the Credit by Examination process.

In order to receive college recognition of completion of articulated high school coursework, the student must be registered at one of the colleges and in good academic standing, and must apply for the recognition. Articulation status will only be granted for courses listed in the college catalog. Articulation of High School (Secondary) coursework is offered under the provisions of the California Administrative Code, Title 5 and the process is included in the Administrative Rules and Procedures.
