ABOUT US

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The Community College League of California is a nonprofit public benefit corporation whose voluntary membership consists of the 72 local community college districts in California. Within the League are two major organizations that share a common mission, staff and fiscal resources: the California Community College Trustees (CCCT) and the Chief Executive Officers of the California Community Colleges (CEOCCC).

LEAGUE BOARDS

Two groups govern the League: CCCT has a 21-member board of directors elected by the 72 local governing boards; CEOCCC has a 15-member board of directors elected by the local community college chancellors, superintendents and presidents. These boards of the League meet a combined 15 times each year. At those meetings action is taken on education policy issues before the state Board of Governors and the legislature. Policy direction also is provided to staff concerning statewide educational policy, research initiatives, publications, workshops,

GOVERNMENT RELATIONS

The League's Government Relations staff represents the GCCT and CEOCCC boards' local perspective on community college educational, fiscal, operational, and governance issues before the Legislature and Executive Branch. The League also provides advocacy and critical guidance to districts on state budget and operational issues and other timely and sensitive legislative issues at both the state and federal level.



SERVICES TO DISTRICTS

The League district services and programs are designed to provide member districts with cost-effective, easy-to-use purchasing, fiscal and foundation services. Services range from fiscal services (TRANs and lease revenue bonds) to more programmatic services such as policy and procedure updates, online library database purchasing and student health insurance.
