Approval to Travel Abroad—International Forensics Association World

Tournament to Rome, Italy, Las Positas College

<u>Background</u>: The Las Positas College forensics team, LPC Talk Hawks, has been invited to participate in the International Forensics Association Tournament in Rome, Italy during March 2012. Eight students and two faculty coaches would like to represent the College at the tournament. The purpose of this trip is to expose our students to the highest caliber of competition from both the United States as well as European institutions. This team has the potential to uphold the successful record that the LPC Talk Hawks have maintained throughout the history of the College.

The Talk Hawks have participated in this competition three times in the past: in Montreal, Canada (Agenda 4.4 November 18, 2008), Prague, Czech Republic (Agenda 4.4 February 21, 2006) and Buenos Aires, Argentina (Agenda 4.4 November 14, 2006). In 2006 and 2009 LPC had the International Champion in Informative Speaking. In 2007 LPC finished as the top two-year institution at the tournament. In 2009 LPC finished 2nd Place overall at the competition.

In recognition of LPC's past success at the tournament, Barbara Baron, president of the International Forensics Association, has generously offered to waive the entry and registration fees for our school. She wishes to make it as financially feasible as possible for a school with the competitive caliber of LPC to attend the event.

Board Policies 6216 (Field Trips) and 6217 (Travel Study Program), Administrative Rules and Procedures, and materials from our insurance broker have been reviewed. The District is in compliance with each of these and has secured all necessary and required waivers.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: That the Board of Trustees approves the LPC Talk Hawks travel abroad for the International Forensics Association Tournament to Rome, Italy, during March 2012. Subject: Approval of Software Agreement Renewal—Sungard Higher Education Banner

Enterprise Software, District

Background: The Chabot-Las Positas Community College District operates the Sungard Higher Education Banner System to provide district-wide enterprise services to support students, faculty, and staff through the use of the comprehensive Banner modules for Student Services, Financial Aid, Business Services, Human Resources and Payroll. Over the years, CLPCCD has gradually transitioned from the client services environment to the Web-based architecture for the Banner services and now to the future direction of Mobile Applications. As new Banner software modules became available, the District reviewed these new functions periodically to determine if these new features align with its Strategic Plan to automate manual or inefficient systems for achieving improved productivity. The District purchased additional Banner modules using Measure B Bond funds. As a result, the District is well positioned with the Banner modules necessary to meet our District ITS Strategic Goals over the next several years. In addition, CLPCCD has installed third party products that interface with Banner using local customizations.

As the District continues to find new alternatives for cost savings in light of the current State budget situation, all software and hardware maintenance contracts that are funded by the District were evaluated and vendors were contacted to determine what multi-year options were available. Hardware and software products that meet the Bond criteria are purchased with Measure B funds. Included with the initial hardware and software purchases is maintenance for a specified period which varies depending on the vendor. With the current economic situation, vendors are more open to extending longer term maintenance agreements to their customers, which lock in the maintenance costs at pricing that provides significant savings to the customer by avoiding the yearly increases which can vary year to year. The District Data Center resides in the Information Technology (IT) Building at Las Positas College which was Measure B funded and all hardware and software supporting the District Enterprise Systems is an integral part of that IT Building. All the Enterprise servers used to support the enterprise software is maintained under a centralized network infrastructure within the IT Building, all of which was Bond funded. Therefore, all equipment within the District Data Center and software residing on that equipment was reviewed for multi-year maintenance contracts.

As part of the cumulative IT cost savings made as a result of the State budget reductions, CLPCCD negotiated a new multi-year software maintenance agreement with Sungard Higher Education for the Banner base modules which support the Student, Financial Aid, Finance, Human Resources, and Payroll functions throughout the district. The base modules include the Internet Native Banner (INB) client portions of the Banner system as well as the Self-Service

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web-based portions of the Banner system, both of which are used throughout all departments at the colleges and district. The Self-Service portion of the system is known as CLASS-Web at Chabot-Las Positas and is heavily utilized by students, faculty, and staff. The new multi-year agreement establishes a guaranteed discount based on the current year pricing with a minimum 4% rate of increase per year that has a compounded effect. This is in contrast to the standard contracts, which were in effect previously and had no limit and varied from 10% or greater dependent on the year. Therefore, the new multi-year agreement provides substantial reduction in annual percentage increases, thus significantly reducing overall maintenance costs for the district over the 4-year period. The costs for a 4-year agreement to support all the Banner Base modules that provide the INB and Self-Service functionality totals \$724,825. This new software agreement covers the 4-year period from December 1, 2011 through November 30, 2015. This 4-year agreement is equivalent to an average of \$181,000 per year, which is a minimum estimated savings of \$120,000 over the term of the contract.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed software agreement renewal with Sungard Higher Education for software maintenance for Banner Base modules that includes INB and Self-Service features at a cost of \$724,825 for a period of four years. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the agreement on behalf of the District.

Approval to Renew - County of Contra Costa, Interagency Agreement

No. 18-252-1, District-Economic Development

<u>Background</u>: Contra Costa County's Employment and Human Services Department has contracted with Chabot-Las Positas Community College District's Economic Development department to provide assessment services for job seekers in that county since July 2010. The County has requested that we continue to provide these services for the 2011-12 fiscal year.

As with the previous agreement (Item 7.3 on July 20, 2010), District's Economic Development Department will be working with Contra Costa's Workforce Development Board to provide programs related workforce development, including those of their One Stop Career Centers. District is contracting with Contra Costa County to provide assessment proctoring services to job seekers and training and technical assistance to both the One Stop Career Center and Workforce Development Board staff. Additionally, District will work with small business community to educate them about assessment tools, gather career and skills data, and deliver training workshops throughout Contra Costa County.

The agreement states that Contra Costa County will pay the District up to \$176,000.00 for assessment and training services provided. This contract has a term of twelve months (July 1, 2011 to June 30, 2012).

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the renewal of County of Contra Costa Interagency Agreement No. 18-252-1, District – Economic Development for the period July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012, in the amount of \$176,000.00. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the standard contract on behalf of the District.
