Acceptance of Subaward Agreement No. 542417 between Community College

Research Center of Teachers College, Columbia University, and Chabot

College

<u>Background:</u> Responding to the need to address the high attrition rates of students in basic skills English and math at community colleges, the Community College Research Center (CCRC) and Chabot College will collaborate on "Scaling Innovation: Examining the Replication of Deeper Learning Instructional Reforms in Developmental Education." This research and implementation project funded by the Hewlett Foundation is designed to identify high-potential developmental education instructional reforms and work with experienced college partners to adapt and scale innovations at multiple colleges.

CCRC is partnering with the California Acceleration Project (CAP), whose project leaders are Language Arts faculty Dr. Katie Hern from Chabot College and Math faculty Myra Snell from Los Medanos College, and representatives from the California Community College Success Network (3CSN), to examine how acceleration strategies for developmental English and math are implemented among a network of selected California community colleges. CCRC will work with the CAP leads to support continued outreach, technical assistance, and faculty developmental activities.

The grant award is \$60,000. Monies will be used to partially offset staffing and travel costs associated with (1) training and implementation activities of CAP, including collaborative professional development, inquiry, and guidance; and (2) participation in convenings to discuss emergent findings and share ideas for scaling and sustaining deeper learning instructional reforms. Chabot's Language Arts Dean will provide grant oversight and serve as the fiscal agent.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed Subaward Agreement No. 542417 between Chabot College and Community College Research Center of Teachers College, Columbia University, in the amount of \$60,000 for the period of September 15, 2011 through September 15, 2013. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the agreement and any future augmentations or amendments to the agreement on behalf of Chabot College.

Acceptance of Subaward Agreement with Stanford University's W.W. Hansen

Experimental Physics Laboratory, Chabot College

Background: Chabot College is entering into a subaward agreement with Stanford University's W.W. Hansen Experimental Physics Laboratory for a total of \$20,000. The agreement is part of our work with the Education and Public Outreach Team for NASA's Solar Dynamics Observatory (SDO). Funds will support the development of a multi-day laboratory exercise that uses SDO data in a meaningful and effective way for community college students. The lab exercise will be shared with at least 4 other sites for formal assessment and then to wide-scale distribution. Chabot College students will benefit from the access to and analysis of SDO data, providing a unique opportunity to analyze real-world data from a one-of-a-kind data source.

Funding for the project is in the amount of \$20,000 for the period of January 17, 2012 through December 20, 2012.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees accepts the proposed Subaward Agreement for Chabot College in the amount of \$20,000 for the period January 17, 2012 through December 20, 2012. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the sub-agreement award on behalf of the District.

Acceptance of Implementation Grant Agreement between The Foundation

for California Community Colleges/LearningWorks and Chabot

College/California Acceleration Project

<u>Background:</u> In an effort to support promising practices and strategies for improving student completion, The Foundation for California Community Colleges/LearningWorks has received funding from the William and Flora Hewlett Foundation and the Walter S. Johnson Foundation (Grantor) to assist with implementation and assessment of innovative efforts for improving student completion. Chabot College/California Acceleration Project is the Sub Grantee.

Grant objectives are to collaborate with LearningWorks to (1) create professional communication materials to influence state and national policy audiences, as well as faculty within and beyond California; and (2) support the spread of curricular and policy innovations from California to nationwide audiences. Lead instructor at Chabot College is Dr. Katie Hern; grant administrator is Dr. Marcia Corcoran, Dean of Language Arts.

The grant award is \$40,000 to cover activities from October 1, 2011, through June 30, 2012 (\$15,000 for professional contracts; \$16,500 for a Lead Math Instructor; \$6,000 for travel and conferences; and \$2,000 for indirect costs to Chabot College).

<u>Recommended Action:</u> That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed grant awarded by The Foundation for California Community Colleges/LearningWorks for Chabot College/California Acceleration Project, in the amount of \$40,000 for the period of October 1, 2011, through June 30, 2012. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the agreement on behalf of the District.

Approval to Enter Into a Memorandum of Understanding with Planned

Parenthood of Mar Monte (PPMM), Las Positas College

<u>Background</u>: Planned Parenthood Mar Monte would like to set up a satellite office in the Student Health and Wellness Center at Las Positas College to provide family planning and men's and women's health services to students each Friday in the Spring and Fall semesters (while class is in session).

Scope of Medical Services to include:

Pregnancy testing; contraceptives, including hormonal contraceptives and condoms; STD testing and follow-up; Emergency contraception; rapid HIV testing; birth control and STD education and counseling; family PACT eligibility screening and certification; referrals for comprehensive reproductive and primary care; and other services and exams may be available dependent on the facility.

Allowing PPMM to offer these services through the Student Health and Wellness Center (SHWC) will allow family planning and women's health services to be offered, free of charge, to our students. Currently the SHWC provides the services, at reduced rates to our students, through our ValleyCare Contract. PPMM would provide many of these services for free.

Additionally, the Associated Students at LPC (ASLPC) support the proposal.

The proposed agreement will commence February 3, 2012 and will continue through December 31, 2012 or terminated by either party upon written notice.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed agreement to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with Planned Parenthood of Mar Monte, Las Positas College, for the period of February 3, 2012 through December 31, 2012. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute this Memorandum of Understanding on behalf of the District.

<u>Background</u>: The District will dispose of personal property that is surplus to the instructional or administrative needs of the District. In this case, the current listing includes obsolete equipment and furniture from Chabot College. When saleable, items will be sold to employees or at auction to the highest bidder. All items are sold or donated in "as is" condition. As standard procedure, notices are sent to the eight (8) school districts in our local service area. Establishing Non-Resident (Out-of-State and International) Tuition Rates for

2012-2013

<u>Background</u>: In accordance with Education Code Section 76140, the Board of Trustees must set the non-resident tuition rate for the succeeding fiscal year. The District served 407 full-time equivalent non-resident students in 2009-2010 and 396 in 2010-2011. In establishing this amount, the District may select one of seven options:

- 1. Statewide average cost of education (\$179)
- 2. District cost of education (\$198)
- 3. District cost with 10% or more noncredit FTES (N/A)
- 4. No more than a contiguous district (\$204)
- 5. No more than District cost; no less than Statewide average cost (\$179-\$198)
- 6. Highest Years Statewide average tuition (\$190)
- 7. No more than 12 comparable states' average tuition (\$331)

The non-resident tuition rate of \$203.00 per semester unit was charged for the 2011-2012 academic year, plus \$12 per semester unit capital outlay fee. The administration recommends the rate of \$213.00 per semester unit for the 2012-2013 academic year, plus \$13 per unit capital outlay fee for a total of \$226 per semester unit. The tuition rate was derived by applying the percentage of increase in the district's cost of education from the prior year. The tuition fee is established using option seven above.

<u>Recommended Action:</u> That the Board of Trustees approves the non-resident tuition rate of \$226.00 per semester unit for the 2012-2013 academic year for non-resident students, international students, and non-immigrant aliens attending on F-1 or other visa types.
