<u>Background</u>: Las Positas College, in partnership with the Alameda County Sheriff's Office, has offered accredited courses in basic law enforcement, specialty law enforcement, incentive program courses, and continuing education training for law enforcement personnel known as the "Sheriff's Academy," since 1999.

This program is a vital educational experience for law enforcement professionals in the Tri-Valley and is one of the many hallmark programs of Las Positas College.

Discussions for the renewal of the agreement have just recently concluded, and both parties are interested in continuing the partnership to this highly successful program.

The term of the two year agreement renewal is October 2, 2013 through October 1, 2015.

Colleges Chancellor's Office (CCCCO), Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: State Chancellor's Office provides allocations to continue activities related to strengthening Career Technical Education (CTE) secondary and college linkages. This grant sustains and improves activities of the 12-13 CTE Transitions Grant approved last year.

The state grant provides \$44,025 in resources to support activities including strengthening of CTE articulation (2+2), increasing the actual number of recent high school CTE students who continue and enroll in Chabot CTE programs, and CTE outreach. This grant works with parallel activities embedded in the CTE Community Collaborative Grant and builds on partnerships and student success goals. There are no local matching requirements.

Approval for Travel Study Program-"Faces of Cuba" and Agreement with

Global Exchange Reality Tours, Chabot College

<u>Background:</u> In accordance with Board Policy 6217, Travel Study Programs, a course has been designed that involves travel and studies abroad. This course will be offered during Winter Break, January 3 through January 14, 2014 as a one (1) unit course. The History discipline supports and affirms the importance of travel studies in Program Reviews.

The cost per participant for the Cuban travel studies program is approximately \$2,750, based on a minimum of 20-25 participants, excluding airfare. The program includes accommodations, guides, ground transportation, activities and meals. A deposit of \$1,000 is required with application and final payment due 45 days in advance of travel.

Course studies examining Cuba are relative to the disciplines of history, anthropology and archaeology. Participants will gather information through direct and participatory observation. Moreover, the contemporary issues facing the United States today surrounding immigration and international relations are extremely relevant for our students and the communities we serve.

The Board of Trustees previously approved travel agreements with Global Exchange Reality Tours to Cuba on October 16, 2012 under item 4.4, October 18, 2011 under item 4.3, May 17, 2011 under item 4.4, Mexico on February 19, 2008 under item 4.3 and 4.4, February 24, 2004 under item 4.5 and 4.6, August 19, 2003 under item 4.1, October 15, 2002 under item 4.7, September 18, 2001 under item 4.3, March 20, 2001 under item 4.4 and August 15, 2000 under item 4.2.

<u>Background</u>: Chabot College was approached by the Business & Entrepreneurship Center (BEC) and Youth Entrepreneurship Program (YEP) to provide support to expand entrepreneurial offerings on campus and to conduct the following activities:

- 2-unit, ENTR-40 course 15 students enrolled
- Extreme Entrepreneurship Tour presented to 400 students
- Mini-Grant Marketing stipend 7 programs promoted
- Pitch Competition Support 1 competition held

BEC will provide up to 50 1-on-1 counseling hours to up to 15 entrepreneurship students. YEP, through its YEP-2-GO program, will provide up to 3 classroom visits from expert small business consultants and entrepreneurs to add further value to course offerings and resources.

BEC and YEP will provide funding not to exceed \$11,000 to offer additional courses and support to Chabot College Entrepreneurship discipline. No local matching funds required.

Colleges, Chancellor's Office Tax Offset Program (COTOP)

Background: Legislation passed in 1982 permitting community colleges to contract with the Chancellor's Office for the collection of outstanding student financial aid obligations owed to the colleges. The Chancellor's Office, acting on behalf of the colleges, may contract with the State Franchise Tax Board for the collection of outstanding or defaulted loans and overpayment of grants from any refund of taxes by the state or from state lottery winnings. Also, legislation (AB 3929, Jones) was passed in 1991 which authorized the collection of proper non-financial aid obligations owed to the District. Annually, community colleges may enter into a contract with the Chancellor's Office and submit the names of students with outstanding obligations. The Chancellor's Office retains 25% of all collections to cover administrative costs of operating the collection program.

The contract will permit the District to continue to submit the names of students with outstanding obligations in order to permit collection of said obligations by the State Franchise Tax Board. This is a renewal of an annual contract with the Chancellor's Office, covering the period from October 1, 2013 through December 20, 2014.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: That the Board of Trustees approves the renewal of contract with the State Chancellor's Office for implementation of the Chancellor's Office Tax Offset Program for the period October 1, 2013 through December 20, 2014. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Chancellor to execute the contract on behalf of the District.
