Approval of Agreement – Berkeley Youth Alternative Employment Plus

(EPII) with Alameda County Workforce Investment Board (ACWIB), Chabot

College

Background: Chabot College is agreeing to be the provider of Youth Services for High Risk Youth living in the Tri-Cities Area of Alameda County. Chabot agrees to provide educational, employment, and social services for high-risk youth ages 16-21, in collaboration with its multiple partners. Youth served include in- and out-of-school youth who are low-income, foster youth, pregnant/parenting teens, recently emancipated, ex-offenders, high-school dropouts or unemployed youth. Partners include the Cities of Fremont, Newark, and Union City; New Haven and Fremont Adult Schools; Tiburcio Vasquez Health Center; Centro de Servicios; and Tri-CED Recycling. The program aims to enroll youth into education and attain a certificate or degree, help them gain employment, and improve their literacy and numeracy skills.

The parties to this Agreement are Chabot College ("Lead Agency") and the Berkeley Youth Alternative ("Contractor "), regarding subcontracting services for the Employment Plus II (EPII) Programs for High Risk Youth that will serve 57 connected and disconnected youth in the Tri-Cities area. It is understood that Chabot College has received a contract from the Alameda County Workforce Investment Board Workforce Investment Act funds to provide an EPII Program and will utilize these funds to reimburse BYA for staffing hours.

Payment shall not exceed the total amount of \$320,000 3 Part-Time Outreach Specialist- \$125,000 Case Manager - \$35,000 Job Developer - \$50,000 Benefits - \$25,000 BYA 9% - \$25,000 27 youth participants work experience for total of \$60,000

The Board of Trustees has previously approved Berkeley Youth Alternative Employment Plus on September 18, 2012 under item 4.3 for \$122,300.

Background: Chabot College was approached by the Business & Entrepreneurship Center (BEC) and Youth Entrepreneurship Program (YEP) to provide additional support to expand entrepreneurial offerings on campus and to conduct the following activities:

- 2-unit, ENTR-40 course 5-10 students enrolled
- 1-unit, Indeation Lab
- 3-unit, "Entrepreneurship Mindset" course
- Pitch Competition Support

BEC will provide up to 50 1-on-1 counseling hours to up to 15 entrepreneurship students. YEP, through its YEP-2-Go program, will provide up to 3 classroom visits from expert small business consultants and entrepreneurs to add further value to course offerings and resources.

BEC and YEP will provide funding not to exceed \$18,000 to offer additional courses and support to Chabot College Entrepreneurship discipline. No local matching funds required.

<u>Background</u>: California's economy depends upon having a good supply of mathematics and science graduates for the State's science and technology jobs. Sutter Affiliate, Chabot College and Las Positas College

<u>Background</u>: Eden Medical Center provides medical care of acute care patients and serves as a primary teaching hospital, playing a key role in the training of medical professionals. Throughout the past three years, Eden Medical Center has provided medical students within the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District with clinical experiences at their institution. Eden Medical Center would like to continue to provide opportunities for medical students through an amendment to the existing affiliation agreement dated May 25, 2010. The term of the proposed amendment is from October 1, 2013 through September 30, 2016.

The Board approved similar agreements to provide clinical training for the Surgical Technology Program with Eden Medical Center, Castro Valley under item 5.4 on February 16, 2010, with Washington Township Health Care District under item 5.5 on February 16, 2010, with Children's Hospital and Research Center, Oakland on January 19, 2010 under item 5.6, and with Stanford Hospital and Clinics on December 8, 2009 under item 5.4.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed Amendment to Affiliation Agreement with Eden Medical Center – A Sutter Affiliate, located at 20103 Lake Chabot Road, Castro Valley, California 94546, to provide clinical training for the Surgical Technology Program. ### ESTABLISHMENT OF THE GANN APPROPRIATIONS LIMIT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2013-14

WHEREAS, the California Legislature enacted Senate Bill 1352 in August 1980, with an effective date of January 1981, to implement Proposition 4, a Constitutional amendment establishing appropriation limits for state and local government units;

WHEREAS, the Governing Board determines that the 2013-14 General Fund Budget, as proposed for adoption, is in conformance with the provisions of Senate Bill 1352 as reflected on the Gann Limit Worksheet, and;

THEREFORE, it is resolved that the Governing Board of Chabot-Las Positas Community College District hereby adopts a revised appropriations limit for 2013-14 of \$ 117,702,254 and estimates that the budget appropriations subject to that limit are \$72,235,821.

Subject: Approval to Renew - County of Contra Costa, Interagency Agreement No. 18-

252-3, District-Economic Development

<u>Background:</u> Contra Costa County's Employment and Human Services Department has contracted with Chabot-Las Positas Community College District's Economic Development department to provide assessment services for job seekers in that county since July 2010. The County has requested that we continue to provide these services for the 2013-14 fiscal year.

As with the previous agreements (Items 7.3 on 7/20/10, 7.1 on 11/15/11, and 7.6 on 7/17/12) we will be working with Contra Costa's Workforce Development Board to provide programs related workforce development, including those of their One Stop Career Centers. District is contracting with Contra Costa County to provide assessment proctoring services to job seekers and training and technical assistance to both the One Stop Career Center and Workforce Development Board staff.

The agreement states that Contra Costa County will pay the District up to \$190,000.00 for assessment and training services provided. This contract has a term of twelve months (July 1, 2013 to June 30, 2014).

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the renewal of County of Contra Costa Interagency Agreement No. 18-252-3, District – Economic Development for the period July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014, in the amount of \$190,000.00. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the standard contract and any future augmentations or amendments on behalf of the District.
