Community College District

<u>Background</u>: The Chabot-Las Positas Community College District has been allocated funding to develop a district-wide consortium focusing on the following state legislated key areas:

- 1. Elementary and secondary basic skills required for high school diploma or equivalent;
- 2. Classes for immigrants and ESL students and workforce pre classes in basic skills;
- 3. Education programs for adults with disabilities;
- 4. Short-term career technical programs with high employment potential; and
- 5. Programs for apprentices.

<u>Background</u>: In order to insure availability of qualified DSA Inspectors of Record (IOR), the District issued RFQ E-O8 on August 6, 2007. Respondents to RFQ E-O8 who were deemed qualified through the evaluation process were so notified and informed they would receive requests to submit resumes for individual projects as required.

A committee reviewed and ranked the resumes submitted for the Library Renovation project at Las Positas College. Based upon the interviews, Mike Centeno of United Inspection Services was selected as the most qualified to provide Division of State Architect inspection services for this project.
