<u>Background</u>: CSUEB and HUSD have received a grant from the Kellogg Foundation to implement best practices in Early Childhood and obtain work as preschool educators. The project is the visionary solution to the problem of uninformed parent/family volunteer participation in the school district's subsidized preschool classrooms.

Chabot College Early Childhood Development has been requested to provide the Early Childhood Development (ECD) courses for parents of children enrolled in Hayward Unified School District. Chabot will provide the faculty and courses/credit; HUSD will provide the facility and CSUEB will provide all funding for this grant project. The courses will be offered from March 2014 through June 2014.

The funding for this MOU is in the amount of \$20,300 for the period beginning March 2014 to June 30, 2014.

Approval of Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) – Marcus Foster Education Fund and Striving Black Brothers Coalition, Chabot College

Background: The Marcus Foster Education Fund would like to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) where it is awarding Chabot College's Striving Black Brothers Coalition (SBBC) a grant for \$10,000 on behalf of the College Bound Brotherhood (CBB), whose goal is to increase the college readiness, access, and completion of African-American young men living in the San Francisco Bay Area. It is a collaborative effort spanning nine Bay Area counties with over 50 organizations involved in the growing network. Funds will support the general operating costs of the SBBC program. Chabot College agrees to forego spending any grant funds on administrative or overhead costs. In addition, SBBC leadership will participate in regional monthly meetings of the CBB Networked Improvement Community to strengthen ties with other community-based organizations and postsecondary institutions dedicated to this project.

The funding for the project is in the amount of \$10,000 for the period of January 15, 2014 through October 31, 2014.

<u>Background</u>: District staff conducted formal Bid No. 14-03 for network infrastructure equipment to be installed in new buildings and to replace aging Cisco equipment at the Chabot College and Las Positas College campuses. The bid was publicly advertised and sixteen (16) bidders were contacted directly. Bids from three (3) bidders were received.

All bids were evaluated by a committee of ITS staff. The responsive bids are listed below:

Business Services staff at the District Office reviewed the committee's evaluation and recommendation and concurs with the recommendation to award to AMS.NET, Inc of Livermore, CA as the lowest responsive and responsible bidder.
