Background: The Chabot Medical Brigades requests approval for an international (Class IV) field trip to Tegucigalpa, Honduras for a medical mission on the dates of January –5, 4, 2016* through January 11, 2016. Chabot Medical Brigades is fully recognized as a student organization by the Chabot College Student Life office and is affiliated with the international nonprofit corporation Global Brigades, Inc.

Students from Chabot Medical Brigades will participate in setting up medical and pharmaceutical services in their assigned community. Acceptance of a Grant Sub-Agreement between Solano Community College

District and Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: This Grant Sub-Agreement outlines the terms for a Faculty Entrepreneurship Champion Mini-Grant with Solano Community College District as part of their "Small Business Sector Navigator" Grant #15-151-010. Funds pay for faculty time for collaboration on the infusion of entrepreneurship curriculum across the disciplines. It also supports the development of low-unit non-credit/credit entrepreneurship courses that can be offered at local adult schools, high schools and community-based service agencies.

The total award amount is \$7,500 and the effective dates of this agreement are from October 22, 2015 through June 30, 2016.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: That the Board of Trustees accepts the Grant Sub-Agreement between Solano Community College District and Chabot College in the amount of \$7,500 for the period of October 22, 2015 through June 30, 2016. Approval of Amendment to the Participation Agreement - HealthStream, Inc.,

Chabot College

Background: In 2009 nursing programs throughout Northern California worked with Health Stream to create a hospital standard review for regulatory compliance standard for all hospitals in Northern California. These online modules would teach and test for compliance in HIPAA; Ethics, Sexual Harassment, Patient Rights, Informed Consent, Advanced Directive, Grievance, Appropriate Care, Culture Competence, Restraints and Seclusion, Patient Abuse/Assault/Neglect as well as standard safety requirements; hand hygiene, Bloodborne, Standard Precautions and Bloodborne Pathogens, lifting/transporting, slips/trips/falls, etc. Students completing these modules would meet the initial hospital requirements in Northern California for clearance to enter and treat patients as "student nurses." The process would eliminate individual hospital requirements for each rotation. The Chabot Nursing Program currently utilizes eight local hospitals for clinical rotations. Staff is working with the Chabot Medical Assistance Program and EMT Program to help standardize the requirements for all health-related studies at Chabot and Las Positas Colleges. These are the same modules currently used at UCSF Benioff Children's Hospital, and Eden Medical Center for their health-related personnel.

Funding for these online classes in school years 2015-2018 is paid directly to HealthStream by students in the Nursing Program at \$14.00 per student for the four modules.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed Amendment to the Participation Agreement with HealthStream, Inc. for the period of December 8, 2015 to July 31, 2018. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the agreement amendment on behalf of the District.

Authorization to Submit the Chabot College and Las Positas College

Student Equity Plans (2015-16) to the California Community Colleges

Chancellor's Office

<u>Background</u>: The 2015-16 State Budget increased funding for Student Equity by \$85 million bringing the total amount of funding for allocation to colleges for Student Equity to \$137.5 million. Funding is calculated by district, since certain components of the funding formula (e.g., participation rate) are only available or are specifically required (i.e., socioeconomic status) to be by district.

SB 860 requires colleges to obtain Board of Trustees approval and submit Student Equity Plans each year.

Chabot College and Las Positas College have developed Student Equity Plans to respond to the findings of the disproportionate impact studies conducted on its student populations. The plans have been developed with college-wide representation through various shared governance groups. Chabot College and Las Positas College Presidents recommend approval of the plans supported by Chabot College and Las Positas College Council's recommendation.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: That the Board of Trustees Authorizes the District's submittal of the Chabot College and Las Positas College Student Equity Plans for 2015-2016 to the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office by December 18, 2015.

Approval of Award of a Piggyback Contract for Desktop Computer Equipment

for Las Positas College using the State of California WSCA-NASPO Cooperative

Purchasing Program

<u>Background</u>: District is preparing for the purchase, delivery and installation of desktop computer equipment for Las Positas College. Las Positas is replacing the Hewlett Packard desktop computer systems in various areas throughout the campus that have exceeded their warranties and need to be upgraded in accordance with our current 4-year life cycle plan. To make the purchase of the required computer equipment, the piggyback contracting method has been selected. Public Contract Code Section 20652 authorizes the use of this method when it is in the best interest of the District.

The Western States Contracting Alliance (WSCA) has formed a cooperative purchasing organization, the National Association of State Procurement Officials (NASPO) to manage a cooperative purchasing program approved by the California's State Chief Procurement Official and make contracts available to authorized governmental entities such as public schools and institutions of higher education. The WSCA-NASPO contract planned for this use is the computer contract (B27164-CA) with Hewlett Packard Company. This piggybackable contract utilizes a previously conducted bidding process and contract award to WSCA members.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the award of a piggyback contract for Desktop Computer Equipment for Las Positas College using the State of California WSCA-NASPO Cooperative Purchasing Program, to Hewlett Packard Company of Omaha, NE, in the respective amounts including taxes, not to exceed \$145,393.68. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the purchase order on behalf of the District.

Chabot College and Las Positas College

<u>Background</u>: Chabot College and Las Positas College have a need to replace the existing Wattstopper lighting control board panels located in ten (10) buildings with the Alerton EMS lighting panels, which must match the existing equipment functions and controls for building automation to reduce energy usage, decrease operational and maintenance expenses and optimize occupant comfort.

Staff has conducted a market survey and determined that there is a limited supply of sources to meet these requirements. The manufacturer, Alerton is the District standard and the industry leader in providing building management solutions which has exclusive distributors and installers. Syserco is the Northern California authorized installer of the Alerton building automation and control systems. Staff has determined that it is in the best interest of the District to purchase and install the Alerton EMS lighting panels from Syserco, Inc. located in Fremont, California.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed award to Syserco, Inc. of Fremont, California in the amount including taxes, not to exceed \$121,912.52 for purchase and installation in ten (10) buildings of the Alerton EMS lighting panels for Chabot College and Las Positas College. It is further recommended that the Board authorizes the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the contract and any future augmentations or amendments to the contract on behalf of the District.

<u>Background</u>: For the past fourteen years, the District has contracted with the City of Hayward for the services of a Hayward Police Department Sergeant to serve as the Chabot College Director of Safety and Security. The agreement includes provisions for a contract extension with the agreement of both parties. The contract extension period is January 1, 2016 through June 30, 2016 in the amount of \$132,022.95.

The cost of the Sergeant to the District for the period January 1, 2016 through June 30, 2016 will be \$22,003.82 per month or \$132,022.95 for salary and benefits for the 2015-2016 fiscal year.

Approval to Receive Funds - Mid-Alameda County Consortium, District-

Economic Development, Chabot College, Las Positas College

<u>Background</u>: Chabot College, Las Positas College and the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District (as fiscal agent) have been part of the Mid-Alameda County Consortium (MACC) for the AB 86 Adult Education Planning Grant project, which was funded by the California Community College Chancellor's Office. This program was created to bring into alignment the offerings of community colleges and their adult schools, to better serve the local adult populations. The planning portion has been completed, and MACC has agreed upon funding for the implementation stage.

The program implementation will support the regional collaboration between Chabot College and Las Positas College and their adult school districts. Projected activities include aligning curriculum and services with adult schools, providing transition services, developing non-credit opportunities, and providing professional development.

Economic Development will serve as the fiscal agent to dispense funds to the Colleges, hire independent contractors as MACC staff, pay for consortium-wide conferences, website hosting, research and reporting, and for mid-year allocations. Breakdown as follows: Chabot: \$149,317; LPC: \$133,443; DO: \$171,473; mid-year allocations: \$230,354; total = \$684,487.

The term of this agreement is from December 9, 2015 through June 30, 2016.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the Receipt of Funds allocated by the Mid-Alameda County Consortium to the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District in the amount of \$684,487 and to serve as fiscal agent for the period of December 9, 2015 to June 30, 2016. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the proposed agreement and any subcontracts on behalf of the District.

Acceptance of Grant Agreement No. 15-0050 - California Community

Colleges Chancellor's Office, District-Economic Development

<u>Background</u>: Chabot-Las Positas Community College District was awarded a grant by the California Community College Chancellor's Office (CCCCO) to serve as the fiscal agent and project manager for Institutional Effectiveness (IEPI) –sponsored efforts to identify, develop and disseminate effective professional, administrative, and educational practices across the system. CLPCCD's Department of Economic Development will create and administer contracts to provide fiscal oversight, as well as serve as project manager, hiring vendors and creating subcontractors as required.

The award amount of the CCCCO Agreement No. 15-0050 is \$12,000,000, which includes funding for required staffing as well as administrative overhead costs. The contract is for the term of December 1, 2015, to November 30, 2016.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees accepts the Grant Agreement No. 15-0050 – California Community College Chancellor's Office, District-Economic Development in the amount of \$12,000,000 from December 1, 2015, to November 30, 2016. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the grant award on behalf of the District.

Career Center

<u>Background</u>: The Tri-Valley One Stop (TVOS) has been selected to serve as a Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) site, to assist community members with tax return preparation and filing and has issued a Memorandum of Understanding. TVOS will recruit and train volunteers to serve as certified tax preparers, reviewers, instructors and site coordinators for the Tax Season 2016.

The United Way of the Bay Area awarded a grant of \$6,000 to offset the cost of serving as a VITA site. The grant period is September 1, 2015-May 31, 2016.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees accepts the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) and grant funding from the United Way of the Bay Area to the District-Economic Development, Tri-Valley One Stop Career Center, in the amount of \$6,000, for the period September 1, 2015 through May 31, 2016. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the MOU on behalf of the District.
