Rural Community College Funding Development Initiative Grant, Las Positas

College

Background: Las Positas College was selected to participate in the Rural Community College Funding Development Initiative, which is led by the American Association of Community Colleges (AACC) and AACC's affiliate council, the Rural Community College Alliance (RCCA). The grant will help Las Positas College to bring together the various agriculturally based economies from the Livermore Valley and develop new programs that link courses at the college to the needs of the local economy. By providing new programs in vocational ESL, water conservation, and viticulture, LPC will be able to support the existing workers in the vineyards as well as bring new workers to the vineyards with skills that match the needs of the employers.

The college will receive: Regular technical assistance by RCCA and AACC on identifying, implementing and leveraging collaborative opportunities with local and state level agricultural cooperatives (12/2015-9/2016) and \$25,000 for general initiative support, based on the budget submitted in the application, which includes, but is not limited to, conference attendance at the Workforce Development Institute, the RCCA's Annual Conference, and a meeting with RCCA in Oklahoma City.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: That the Board of Trustees accepts the Rural Community College Funding Development Initiative Grant Award between Las Positas College and the American Association of Community Colleges (AACC) and the Rural Community College Alliance (RCCA). Approval of Agreement Renewal – Child Development Training Consortium

2015-2016 Instructional Agreement No. 15-16-2620 with Yosemite

Community College District, Las Positas College

<u>Background</u>: Las Positas College has received a program renewal for the Child Development Training Consortium (CDTC) 2015-2016 Instructional Agreement No. 15-16-2620 with the Yosemite Community College District (YCCD). The program allows the College to generate up to 550 units of college credit by enrolling students in courses required by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing to obtain a new or renew a currently held Child Development Permit. As these courses do not generate state apportionment, the agreement provides the College with \$25 per enrolled unit of course work, not to exceed a total of \$16,250.

The College has been continuously involved with the YCCD/CDTC and has received an annual renewal since 1993.

The proposed agreement renewal is for the period of September 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed renewal agreement for the Child Development Training Consortium 2015-2016 Agreement No. 15-16-2620 with Yosemite Community College District, Las Positas College, in the amount not to exceed \$16,250 for the period of September 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016. Emergency Medical Technician Students (EMT), Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: Paramedics Plus of Alameda County is a provider of emergency medical service, including both advanced life support and basic life support pre-hospital care and transport. Paramedics Plus has agreed to assist Chabot College EMT students by providing a limited field internship experience for students. Paramedics Plus is the new 911 provider and the ambulances respond to emergency 911 calls, each ambulance has an EMT and Paramedic. The experience is beneficial for Chabot students to see the wide range of patient care in the field setting.

This agreement shall become effective February 1, 2016 ("Effective Date") for a term of forty-eight (48) months from the Effective Date.

Past actions by the Board of Trustees includes approval for field internship agreements on February 21, 2012 under item 5.5.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed Agreement Renewal with Paramedics Plus of Alameda County effective February 1, 2016 for a term of forty-eight (48) months, Chabot College. Approval of Internship Program Agreement – City of Hayward and Chabot

College

<u>Background</u>: The internship program is a joint effort between the City of Hayward and Chabot College- CalWORKS Work-Study Program. The goal of the program is to offer work experience and exposure to local government to Chabot College students interested in pursuing this field of study and for the Office of the City Clerk to utilize the skillset of qualified interns. The duration of the internship would be for the length of the semester with deviations subject to the students' performance.

The internship will be a paid position at an hourly rate of \$10.50. Chabot College will compensate student interns directly, with 75% of the wages funded through the CalWORKS Work-Study Program. Through an identified budget from the Office of the City Clerk, the City of Hayward agrees to reimburse Chabot College at the end of each school semester for 25% of the wages paid to student interns, amounting to \$2.625 per hour. The City Clerk's Office anticipates having each intern work no more than 20 hours per week and plans to have two interns working concurrently each semester. The maximum hours worked by a student intern during the spring or fall semester will be 400 hours, based upon the spring/fall semester each being approximately 20 weeks long. The maximum hours worked by a student intern during the summer semester will be 240 hours, based on the summer semester of approximately 12 weeks long.

The proposed agreement will become effective upon agreement by both parties and shall remain in effect for two years. Either party can terminate the agreement upon giving a 30-day prior written notice.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed Internship Program Agreement with City of Hayward, Chabot College effective January 20, 2016 for the period of two years. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the agreement on behalf of the District.

Approval for Establishing Non-Resident (Out-of-State and International)

Tuition Rates for 2016-2017

<u>Background:</u> In accordance with Education Code Section 76140, the Board of Trustees must set the non-resident tuition rate for the succeeding fiscal year. In establishing this amount, the District may select from one of the following seven options:

- 1. Statewide average cost.
- 2. District average cost.
- 3. District average cost with 10% or more non-credit FTES.
- 4. Contiguous district.
- 5. No more than district average cost; no less than statewide average cost.
- 6. Statewide average fee, from 2014-15 (\$211 per semester unit; \$141 per quarter unit).
- 7. No more than average tuition of 12 states with cost of living comparable to California.

The District served 380 full-time equivalent non-resident students in 2013-2014 and 357 in 2014-2015. The non-resident tuition rate of \$243.00 per semester unit was charged for the 2015-2016 academic year. The administration recommends the rate of \$226.00 per semester unit for the 2016-2017 academic year, plus a \$17.00 per unit capital outlay fee for a total of \$243 per semester unit.

<u>Recommended Action:</u> That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed non-resident tuition rate of \$243.00 per semester unit for the 2016-2017 academic year for non-resident students, international students, and non-immigrant aliens attending on F-1 or other visa types.

Approval of Professional Services Contract for General Obligation Bond

Managing Consultant and Polling Services

Background: The Board of Trustees at its September 18, 2012 meeting approved the Facilities Master Plan Update, District-Wide. Subsequently, at its November 17, 2015 meeting, the Board accepted the District's Educational Master Plans and Districtwide Strategic Plan. The districtwide plans identified the capital needs necessary to support the programmatic needs at the two campuses. In order to meet the needs of the colleges, the District is considering a general obligation bond measure to be placed on the November 2016 ballot. In advance of the passage of the appropriate resolution by the Board of Trustees which will formally approve the placement of the general obligation bond measure before the voters, it is prudent to conduct a feasibility study. The study will include a polling of the electorate to assess the basic viability of a bond measure. The strategy for such an information effort has led to a greater success rate for California public education. Districts customarily seek professional assistance from firms specializing in this work. The District senior staff met with two such firms and selected Public Finance Strategies LLC, DBA TBWB Strategies with offices located in San Francisco, California. The base consulting fee for their services is \$7,500 per month with an additional \$1,000 per month in other incurred expenses. The costs for polling and informational material are listed in Exhibit 1 of the contract.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves a Professional Services Contract for General Obligation Bond Managing Consultant and Polling Services, to Public Finance Strategies LLC, DBA TBWB Strategies, in an amount not to exceed \$8,500 per month. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the contract on behalf of the District.

Inspection Services Agreement with Nor Cal Inspection for DSA Inspection Services for Building 100, Library Project at Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: On October 21, 2014, the Board of Trustees authorized to enter into an agreement with Nor Cal Inspection to provide Division of State Architect (DSA) Inspection Services for Building 100, Library Project at Chabot College. The Phase 2 scope of work for the elevator and interiors has been added to the scope of the original project.

Approval of Award of a Piggyback Contract for Furniture and Equipment for

Chabot College, Building 100-Library, First Floor using the CollegeBuys

Purchasing Program

<u>Background</u>: District Staff is preparing for the purchase, delivery and installation of furniture for Chabot College, Building 100-Library, First Floor for the sole use of the Chabot College Library facility. To make the purchase of the required furniture items, the piggyback contracting method has been selected. Public Contract Code Section 20652 authorizes the use of this method when it is in the best interest of the District.

The CollegeBuys Purchasing Program is a cooperative purchasing program made available by the Foundation for California Community Colleges. The CollegeBuys contract planned for this use is the furniture contract with Krueger International, Inc. This piggybackable contract utilizes a previously conducted bidding process and contract award of the San Mateo Community College District.
