Acceptance of the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (CCCCO) Community Colleges Basic Skills and Student Outcome Transformation Program Grant, Chabot College (No. 16-068-046)

<u>Background</u>: Currently in the California Community Colleges, more than three-quarters of incoming students who undergo assessment are assigned to one or more basic skills (remedial) courses in mathematics, English writing, or English reading. Once assigned to remediation, relatively few students successfully complete college-level coursework in these subject areas and go on to achieve their educational goals.

In response to this issue, the CCCCO created the Community Colleges Basic Skills and Student Outcomes Transformation Program that provides Proposition 98 funds to improve the progression rate of basic skills students from remedial education to college-level instruction. The purpose of these grants is to enable colleges receiving an award to implement or expand innovations and redesign in the areas of assessment, student services, and instruction.

Chabot College is 1) redesigning its basic skills math course sequence so there are three or fewer courses below transfer-level math; 2) implementing and evaluating the use of multiple measures in placing students in math courses; 3) ensuring that basic skills math course sequences are aligned to their major/career interests (e.g., Liberal Studies/Allied Health, Business and STEM); and 4) developing and piloting co-requisite courses in key gatekeeper courses.

The project funding period is July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2019 and the total award amount over the three-year project period is \$1,067,773. The effective dates of this agreement are from July 19, 2016 through June 30, 2017. An advance payment will be made as soon as the Grant Agreement is fully executed.

The Community Colleges Basic Skills and Student Outcomes Transformation Program grant (No. 15-068-059) has been awarded to Las Positas College to meet the following objectives:

- 1. Implement Multiple Measure Placement for math and English.
- 2. Continue to design and implement co-requisite courses for basic skills math classes, shorten the math sequence and offer additional learning support services.
- 3. Design and implement fast-tracked math classes, allowing students a pathway that is accelerated through the program.
- 4. Provide professional development for English and math faculty to improve the overall educational experience to meet the diverse needs of the students in the classroom.
- 5. Integrate adult education work at the local and regional level to build pathways to college-level work.

The total award amount is \$1,491,121 for a maximum of three years with effective dates of July 19, 2016 to June 30, 2019.

<u>Background</u>: Chabot College entered into a sub-award agreement with Contra Costa Community College District for a total of \$1,281,000 from October 1, 2012 to September 30, 2016. The grant award was augmented by \$184,640 for a total amount of \$1,465,640 for the period of October 1, 2012 through September 30, 2016.

Past Board of Trustees actions included the MOU approved on March 19, 2013 under item 4.3.

Assessment, Remediation & Retention for Nursing Enrollment Growth and

Retention Program Grant, Chabot College (No. 16-200-003)

<u>Background</u>: The intent of these funds is to respond to the nursing shortage by increasing the capacity of community college nursing programs and, ultimately, increasing the number of licensed nurses. The funds allocated to colleges as a result of this program will provide the opportunity for Associate Degree Nursing Programs (ADN) to expand and/or maintain prior expansion of the number of students enrolled in their programs for a two-year period pending availability of funds for the second fiscal year, and to provide funds to assist students to succeed.

Chabot College will use these funds to increase the retention of nursing students through targeted case management of nursing students, additional skills lab support, simulation lab support and instruction, tutoring, faculty professional development, review courses, book and uniform scholarships, equipment and supplies to ensure that the nursing students are working with equipment that meets current industry standards.

Funding for the project is in the amount of \$114,000 for the period July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees accepts the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office Assessment, Remediation & Retention for Nursing Enrollment Growth and Retention Program Grant for Chabot College in the amount of \$114,000 for the period of July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017. Sub-award Agreement with California State University Easy Bay (CSUEB)

Chabot College

Background: Chabot College is entering into a Sub-award agreement with California State University, East Bay (CSUEB) for a total of \$487,258. The agreement is part of a U.S. Department of Education Promise Neighborhoods implementation grant that CSUEB received in January 2012. Grant funds pay for implementing activities with CSUEB and multiple partners, a part of the Hayward Promise Neighborhood to build a cradle-to-career continuum, of solutions that targets an underserved neighborhood in Hayward. Partners include the City of Hayward, 4C's of Alameda County, Eden Area ROP, Hayward Unified School District and Hayward Public Library. Chabot College agrees to implement the strategies and solutions it has committed to as outlined in the agreement.

This Sub-award agreement covers the fifth year of CSUEB's funding for calendar year 2016, with an award to Chabot College in the amount of \$487,258 for the period ending December 31, 2016 and does not include any approved carry-forward balances from previous implementation years.

<u>Background</u>: In August 2015, the Board approved an initial agreement with University of California- Davis, to support and enhance transfers by Chabot College and Las Positas College students to the University. Colleges, Chancellor's Office Tax Offset Program (COTOP)

<u>Background</u>: Legislation was passed in 1982 permitting community colleges to contract with the Chancellor's Office for the collection of outstanding student financial aid obligations owed to the colleges. The Chancellor's Office, acting on behalf of the colleges, may contract with the State Franchise Tax Board for the collection of outstanding or defaulted loans and overpayment of grants from any refund of taxes by the state or from state lottery winnings. Also, legislation (AB 3929, Jones) was passed in 1991 which authorized the collection of proper non-financial aid obligations owed to the District. Annually, community colleges may enter into a contract with the Chancellor's Office and submit the names of students with outstanding obligations. The Chancellor's Office retains 25% of all collections to cover administrative costs of operating the collection program.

The contract will permit the District to continue to submit the names of students with outstanding obligations in order to permit collection of said obligations by the State Franchise Tax Board. This is a renewal of an annual contract with the Chancellor's Office, covering the period from October 1, 2016 through December 20, 2017.

Staff has determined that it is in the best interest of the District to purchase and install the EV Charging Stations from ABM Electrical and Lighting Solutions, Inc. located in Pleasanton, California.

Acceptance of a Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Grant Award—Alameda County Workforce Development Board (ACWDB) to the Tri-Valley One Stop Career Center, District - Economic Development

Background: To continue its work serving unemployed and under-employed persons in our area, the Tri-Valley One Stop Career Center (TVOS) has been awarded a Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WOPA) grant in the amount of \$328,402 for program year 2016-2017, for the Adult and Dislocated Workers' Programs. The TVOS's job training system is designed to increase the employment, retention and earnings of participants, and to increase occupational skill attainment of participants. The goals of these efforts are to improve the quality of the workforce, reduce welfare dependency, and enhance the productivity and competitiveness of the nation. TVOS will continue to provide a streamlined service system, which includes empowering individuals through information and access to training resources, providing universal access to core services, providing locally defined programs to meet the needs of employers and improving services to youth.

The Board of Trustees accepted similar Alameda County Workforce Development Board grants in 2007-08 for \$327,269; 2008-09 for \$383,924; 2009-10 for \$349,364; 2010-11 for \$719,615; 2011-12 for \$393,633; 2012-13 for \$447,199; 2013-14 for \$394,033; 2014-15 for \$391,499; and 2015-16 for 348,402.
