WHEREAS, due to a lack of work or a lack of funds in the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District for the 2016-2017 school year; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Board of the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District hereby finds it necessary and in the best interest of the District to eliminate and reduce the classified service as specified below;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that as of the 28th day of February 2017, the following positions be eliminated or reduced:

### Chabot College

- 1. One Grant Project Coordinator, Hayward Promise Neighborhood (2CMA06), 40 hours/week, 12 months
- 2. Two Outreach Specialist (2CEX27 and 2CEX26), 40 hours/week, 12 months (\*Positions vacant prior to layoff date).
- 3. One Counselor Assistant II (2CDS06), 40 hours/week, 12 months (\*Position vacant prior to layoff date).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chancellor or her designee is authorized and directed to give notice of layoff to all affected employee(s) and to the appropriate exclusive bargaining representative pursuant to district rules and regulations and applicable provisions of the Education Code not later than sixty (60) days prior to the effective date of such reductions or discontinuance as set forth above.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chancellor and her designee be authorized and directed to take any other actions necessary to effectuate the intent of this resolution.

Acceptance of Grant Sub-Agreements in Support of Chabot College's California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (CCCCO) Industry-Driven Regional Collaborative (IDRC) Grant: Acute Labor Needs, Industry-

Recognized Credentials and 21st Century Skills Grant

Background: The Board accepted the CCCCO IDRC Grant at the June 21, 2016 meeting as Item 4.9. The following sub-award agreements are being issued to 10 community college district partners as part of the implementation of IDRC grant activities as detailed in the grant proposal. The grant supports the work of the IDRC Automotive Technology Urban Area Consortium which includes large urban colleges – 6 in the San Francisco Bay region and 4 in the Los Angeles-Orange County area.

The goal of the IDRC Automotive Technology Urban Area Consortium is to enhance curriculum through employer input and engagement so that automotive technology students master the skills necessary for becoming successful employees. To achieve this goal, three major objectives have been identified: expand instruction of appropriate content knowledge, improve student "soft skill" performance, and refine those abilities through improved work experience (internship) opportunities. Specific deliverables include revisions (piloting or modification) to Hybrid, EV and Fuel Cell curriculum; identification of needed soft skills followed by the use of skill assessment tools and appropriate training; and the expansion of work experience opportunities using the internship practices found to be most effective.

Sub-award agreements are being issued to the following community college districts as partners with Chabot College in this work. The amount of each sub-award is detailed below:

Background: The California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (CCCCO) Basic Skills Partnership Pilot grant was awarded to Ohlone College in July 2016. Ohlone College has contracted out with CSUEB to serve as the pass-through agency for issuing sub-award agreements to the other partner colleges and universities in support of Greater Bay Area K20 Basic Skills Consortium. This new consortium seeks to pilot efficient and effective methods of coordinating basic skills instruction and services between the California Community Colleges and California State University (CSU) systems to better meet the needs of students and leverage resources between the two public higher education systems to serve the needs of these students. This is to be achieved through the implementation of partnerships between the following community college districts and CSU campuses: Berkeley City College, Chabot College, Las Positas College, Diablo Valley College, Mission College, the Peralta Community College District, CSUEB, San Francisco State University and San Jose State University.

A Chabot College lead representative will be assigned to serve on the consortium Steering Committee to advise and assist with the implementation of all aspects of the grant. The representative will serve as the local champion for the consortium within the Chabot College campus community and will convene ad-hoc campus working groups to inform the work of the consortium. He/she will also recruit campus representatives to participate in ad-hoc working groups consisting of representatives across the Bay Area region from other partnering institutions in order to assist with alignment and integration efforts. Finally, the lead representative will be responsible for working with consortium grant staff to secure any information needed for reporting purposes.

The project funding period is July 1, 2016 – June 30, 2018 and the total sub-award amount over the two-year project period is \$140,000. The sub-award period of performance funded in this action is July 1, 2016 – June 30, 2017 in the amount of \$70,000. A second year of funding is expected for the period July 1, 2017 – June 30, 2018 in the amount of \$70,000. No activities under the grant will be undertaken prior to Board approval of the agreement.

Child Counts Program, Chabot College (Contract Number CB2016-17-003)

Background: First 5 Alameda County developed a strategic plan referred to as Every Child Counts that uses a cross-discipline approach in serving children age zero to five years old and their families. Chabot College has been funded to coordinate Teacher Pathways/Associate of Arts Learning Communities, provide support and advising, and provide professional development services to the Early Childhood Education community. This contract amendment includes an additional \$8,000 for an ECD 67 course as well as revised Exhibits and Attachments that reflect this additional activity.

First 5 would like to amend the contract made and entered into on July 1, 2016. The total award amount is \$58,000 and the effective dates of this amended agreement are from November 15, 2016 through June 30, 2017.

Las Positas College

<u>Background</u>: The College requires students in the Emergency Medical Training-Paramedic (EMT-P) program to successfully complete field internships ("clinical experience"). This is a renewal of a previous contract with American Medical Response (AMR), to be a service provider for the EMT-P program.

The purpose of this agreement is to establish the respective responsibilities and duties of the College and AMR while students are participating in field internship programs. AMR will provide field internships for the purpose of training students enrolled in the Las Positas College EMT-P program, and training will be under the supervision of an experienced AMR employee who shall be selected in accordance with the Las Positas College EMT-P program at no cost to the College.

The agreement will become effective when signed by all parties. This agreement shall be for a term of twenty-four (24) months from the effective date. The agreement may be terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice.

Approval of Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) – Umoja Community

Education Foundation and Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: The purpose of this agreement is to partner with the Umoja Community Education Foundation to serve as a critical resource dedicated to enhancing the cultural and educational experiences of African American and other educationally disadvantaged students. Umoja believes that when the voices and histories of students are deliberately recognized, the opportunity for self-efficacy emerges and a foundation is formed for academic success.

In this MOU Chabot Community College agrees to join the statewide Umoja Community Education Foundation of California. The college is required to maintain consortium membership during the term of this MOU, which requires an annual payment of \$1,000, payable within thirty (30) days of the Effective Date, November 16, 2016.

This MOU will be in effect from November 16, 2016 through June 30, 2017 and will automatically renew for subsequent one-year terms unless terminated at an earlier date.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Umoja Community Education Foundation of California and Chabot College effective November 16, 2016 through June 30, 2017 and subsequent one year terms unless terminated. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the MOU on behalf of the District.

Approval of Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)— Tri-Valley Occupational Program, District - Economic Development, Tri-Valley

One-Stop Career Center

<u>Background</u>: As part of its contract, the Tri-Valley One Stop (TVOS) is required by its primary funder, the Alameda County Workforce Development Board, to partner with organizations that serve community members who are unemployed or under-employed, and provide resources as they are available.

The Tri-Valley Regional Occupational Program (Tri-Valley ROP) is in need of office space for their Adult and Career Education (ACE) Transition Specialist. The ACE Transition Specialist will serve community members located in the Dublin, Livermore and Pleasanton school districts, as well as in the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District. TVOS will provide office space, including a computer, phone and access to the shared copier, for no charge to the Tri-Valley ROP for the ACE Transition Specialist at its Dublin location. The ACE Transition Specialist will not be compensated in any way by TVOS nor by CLPCCD.

The partnership memorandum of understanding and the provision of the in-kind contribution of office space are for the period of November 16, 2016-June 30, 2017.
