Background: The Mid-Alameda County Consortium (MACC) was developed in response to AB 86, the planning legislation that requires community colleges, K-12 districts, and community partners to develop regional plans for improving adult education. MACC includes ten member organizations: Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot College, Las Positas College, Castro Valley Unified School District (Primary for Consortium's Application), Dublin Unified School District, Hayward Unified School District, Livermore Joint Unified School District, Pleasanton Unified School District, San Leandro Unified School District, and San Lorenzo Unified School District. Consortia are required to provide evidence of member participation and appointment of representatives by their respective governing boards in accordance with AB 104, the legislation guiding implementation of AB 86 funds. There is no cost to the district for participating in the consortia since all expenses are covered through AB 104.

<u>Background:</u> Chabot College has received an unsolicited augmentation of \$12,379 (4.25% of the 2017-18 grant amount) for the 2018 – 2019 program year from the U.S. Department of Education. The Board of Trustees approved the original grant award under item 4.1 at the September 20, 2016 Board meeting and an additional augmentation as Item 4.4 at the October 24, 2017 Board meeting.

Funds support the TRIO Educational Talent Search (ETS) Program at Chabot College. The TRIO ETS Program serves 7th through 12th grade students in the San Lorenzo and Hayward Unified School Districts who are both low-income and first-generation college-bound, to ensure students persist from grade to grade, graduate from high school, and ultimately attend and graduate college. The TRIO ETS Program offers a variety of activities designed to impact educational outcomes including: s0tudent advising and mentoring; homework and tutoring assistance; college and financial aid application assistance; trips to college campuses, cultural and career-related events; as well as summer programming. TRIO ETS is an essential component of the cradle to college to career pipeline and a vital strategy in ensuring student equity and access.

The grant augmentation is in the amount of \$12,379 is being executed as of October 17, 2018 with the effective date of September 1, 2018 through August 31, 2019.

<u>Background:</u> The TRIO Student Support Services grant targets disabled, low-income, and first-generation college students. The grant continues funding for Chabot's successful ASPIRE program that has been operating since 2005. The ASPIRE Program seeks to narrow and/or close the achievement gap by providing comprehensive academic development, case management, financial aid education, and financial literacy services.

ASPIRE features structured first year experiences, individualized continuous follow-up in Years 2-5, a strong academic, transfer and career emphasis, and group services to maximize student contact. This includes a Summer Readiness Program, close monitoring and follow-up on student progress and continuous program activities that keep students engaged and connected to ASPIRE staff. ASPIRE will provide a safety net for low-income, first-generation and disabled students and help make their dream of a postsecondary education a reality.

Funding for the project is in the amount of \$231,103 per year for five years (total \$1,155,515) for the period September 1, 2015 through August 31, 2020. This year's grant award augments the 2018-19 award amount by \$23,253 for a total of \$254,356. This award is being executed as of October 17, 2018 with an effective date of September 1, 2018 through August 31, 2019.

<u>Background:</u> The TRIO Student Support Services grant targets disabled, low-income, and first-generation college students. This SSS grant continues funding for Chabot's EXCEL Program that targets Chabot's large English as a Second Language student population. Latino and Asian-American students comprise the majority of the ESL students.

The program seeks to narrow and/or close this gap by providing comprehensive English language development support in college courses, case management, financial aid and financial literacy services. The program recruits from all areas of the college utilizing frequent and intrusive student contacts and strong academic supports, led by ESL faculty, to retain students. Services include a Summer Readiness Program, close monitoring and follow-up on progress and continuous program activities that keep students engaged and in contact with SSS ESL faculty and staff. This program is a collaborative effort of ESL and Counseling faculty and strives to increase college access and success for this historically underrepresented population.

Funding for the project is in the amount of \$220,000 per year for five years (total \$1,100,000) for the period September 1, 2015 through August 31, 2020. This year's grant award augments the 2018-19 award amount by \$22,136 for a total of \$242,136. This award is being executed as of October 17, 2018 with an effective date of September 1, 2018 through August 31, 2019.

Background: Chabot College has received a Year 3 renewal of the TRIO-STEM grant including an unsolicited augmentation of \$22,136 for the 2018-2019 program year from the US Department of Education. Funds support the TRIO-STEM Program at Chabot College. The TRIO-STEM program academically prepares its program students for transfer to four-year institutions, to assure their ability to attain baccalaureate degrees in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) fields. The Chabot TRIO-STEM Program benefits all Chabot students, but targets students from low income families, students who are the first generation in their family to complete college, and students with disabilities.

Funding for the project is in the amount of \$220,000 per year for five years (total \$1,100,000) for the period September 1, 2015 through August 31, 2020. The budget period of September 1, 2018 through August 31, 2019 includes the \$22,136 augmentation for a total of \$242,136. The grant award is in the amount of \$242,136 and is being executed as of October 17, 2018 with the effective date of September 1, 2018 through August 31, 2019.

<u>Background:</u> Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College requires students in the Emergency Medical Training-Paramedic (EMT-P) program to successfully complete field internships. This is a renewal of a previous contract with American Medical Response (AMR), to be a service provider for the EMT-P program.

The purpose of this agreement is to establish the respective responsibilities and duties of the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College and AMR while students are participating in field internship programs. AMR will provide field internships for the purpose of training students enrolled in the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College EMT-P program, and training will be under the supervision of an experienced AMR employee who shall be selected in accordance with the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College EMT-P program at no cost to the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College.

The agreement will commence on November 1, 2018. This agreement shall be for a term of twenty-four (24) months. The agreement may be terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice.
