<u>Background</u>: Las Positas College entered into an agreement with JFF on August 22, 2018 to perform a scope of work with a value of \$15,000 for completion of serving forty (40) students. The scope of work includes: a) Certificate Review; b) Certificate Credit Design and Delivery; Enrollment, Retention, and Completion Support; c) Technical Assistance; and, d) Reporting and Data Collection. With over 150,000 open positions, Information Technology support is one of the fastest growing fields. This certificate program is designed to give students the training and experience they need to start a career in tech support. The amended agreement has a value of \$30,000 based upon eighty (80) students completing the program.

Scope of Work Description: Attachment A includes the scope in detail, along with the payment schedule; Attachment B includes the budget for the scope of work to be performed by Las Positas College.

The time frame for this scope of work will be from August 22, 2018 through February 16, 2019.

<u>Background:</u> Las Positas College has received \$60,000 in supplemental funds from the U.S. Department of Education to support the Title V Hispanic-Serving Institution – Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) Grant.

Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College plans to host a speaker series to inform and outreach to underrepresented students and the greater community on financial literacy, knowledge of economics, and full understanding of higher education financing and repayment. Funding will allow Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College to create a new student online orientation that is informative, creative, and interactive to introduce financial literacy, protecting free speech to allow diverse ideas or viewpoints, and foster knowledge of the common rights and responsibilities of American citizenship and civic participation. The supplemental funds must be expended no later than September 30, 2019.

<u>Background:</u> Las Positas College, Veterans First Program applied for and has received a competitive Veterans Resource Center state grant provided by the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office. The goal of the one-time funding is to support California Community Colleges that have no or limited Veterans Resource Center and to develop, expand, or increase programs and services available to veteran students. The Las Positas College Veterans First Program was awarded \$200,000.

The Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College, Veterans First Program plans to utilize the funds to help increase awareness, access, and usage of student support services including, but not limited to, the Disabled Student Programs & Services (DSPS), Extended Opportunity Programs & Services (EOPS), Financial Aid, and Tutorial Center. The new funding will also provide the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College, Veterans First Program to augment Operation Gateway, the two-day intensive new student orientation for veterans, provide additional academic support services for students completing gateway courses, and improve case management to promote student success.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: That the Board of Trustees accepts the Veterans Resource Center grant award – California Community Colleges Chancellors Office, Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College in the amount of \$200,000, for the period of October 1, 2018 to December 31, 2020. Positas Community College District, Las Positas College

<u>Background:</u> The Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College requires students in the Emergency Medical Response (EMR)/Paramedic Program to successfully complete field internships. This is a new contract and a newly established connection between Sutter Valley Hospitals and the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College EMR/Paramedic Program. Sutter Valley Hospitals has agreed to open their doors and provide our students within the EMR/Paramedic Program the ability to gain valuable experience and conduct their internship hours as required by the EMR/Paramedic Program.

The purpose of this agreement is to establish the respective responsibilities and duties of the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College and Sutter Valley Hospitals while students are participating in field internship programs. Sutter Valley Hospitals will provide field internships for the purpose of training students enrolled in the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College EMR/Paramedic Program. Training will be under the supervision of an experienced Sutter Valley Hospitals employee, who shall be selected in accordance with the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College EMR/Paramedic Program at no cost to the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College.

The agreement will commence on December 1, 2018. This agreement shall remain in effect for a term of thirty-six (36) months and then reviewed at that time for possible renewal. The agreement may be terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice.

<u>Background:</u> Las Positas College is pursuing the approval of the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Umoja Community Education Foundation. In January 2018, the Umoja Community Foundation received 2.5 million dollars of ongoing funding from the State of California. Of that amount, 1.2 million dollars has been identified for local Umoja programs for the 2019 calendar year. Umoja and Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College shall work together to provide a program for African American and other underrepresented students in a manner consistent with and in furtherance of this MOU and the Minimum Core Requirements.

The agreement will be for the period of November 14, 2018 through June 30, 2019, and shall be renewed automatically for subsequent one-year terms for no more than five years. The MOU may be terminated by either party with thirty (30) days' notice to the other party.

Background: The Mid-Alameda County Consortium (MACC) was developed in response to AB 86, the planning legislation that requires community colleges, K-12 districts, and community partners to develop regional plans for improving adult education. MACC includes ten member organizations: Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot College, Las Positas College, Castro Valley Unified School District (Primary for Consortium's Application), Dublin Unified School District, Hayward Unified School District, Livermore Joint Unified School District, Pleasanton Unified School District, San Leandro Unified School District, and San Lorenzo Unified School District. Consortia are required to provide evidence of member participation and appointment of representatives by their respective governing boards in accordance with AB 104, the legislation guiding implementation of AB 86 funds. There is no cost to the district for participating in the consortia since all expenses are covered through AB 104.

Subject: Adoption of Resolution No. 02-1819—Authorization to Adopt Revised Uniform

Public Construction Cost Accounting Act

Background: The California Legislature passed the California Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act (PCC §22000 et seq.) to promote uniformity of bidding procedures and cost accounting standards for construction projects performed and/or contracted for by public entities in the State. The Act established higher bidding thresholds; simplifies the bidding process; increases the likelihood of receiving bids from responsible bidders; and minimizes the serious limitations of using our employees for public works projects.

On Thursday, November 1, 2018, State Controller Betty T. Yee, issued a letter to all public agencies subject to the terms of the Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act of an Increase in the Informal Bid Limit Pursuant to Public Contract Code Section 22032. The letter informed the District that the informal bid limit prescribed by Section 22032 of the Public Contract Code will be increased from \$175,000 to \$200,000. With this revision, the District will continue to implement the necessary safeguards to accommodate the positive aspects of the Act while maintaining the accountability measures in our bidding processes. Through adoption by resolution, the District may avail itself of the provision in the revised Act.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees adopts the proposed Resolution No. 02-1819—Authorization to Adopt Revised Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act.

## AUTHORIZATION TO ADOPT THE UNIFORM PUBLIC CONSTRUCTION COST ACCOUNTING ACT

WHEREAS, prior to the passage of Assembly Bill no. 1666, Chap. 1054 Stats. 1983, which added Chapter 2 commencing with Section 22000 to Part 3 of Division 2 of the Public Contract Code, existing law did not provide a uniform cost accounting standard for construction work performed or contracted by local public agencies; and

WHEREAS, Public Contract Code Section 22000 et seq., the Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act, establishes such a uniform cost accounting standard; and

WHEREAS, the Commission established under the Act has developed uniform public construction cost accounting procedures for implementation by local public agencies in the performance of or in the contracting for construction of public projects; and

WHEREAS, the informal bid limit prescribed by Section 22000 to Part 3 of Division 2 of the Public Contract Code, will be increased to \$200,000 effective for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2019.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CHABOT-LAS POSITAS COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT, hereby elects under Public Contract Code Section 22032 to become subject to the uniform public construction cost accounting review procedures, as they may each from time to time be amended, and directs that the Vice Chancellor of Business Services notify the State Controller forthwith of this election.

<u>Background:</u> On January 16, 2018, the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District's (CLPCCD) Board of Trustees approved a grant award from the California's Community College Chancellor's Office (CCCCO) to serve as the fiscal agent for the Umoja Programs. Umoja serves at-risk, educationally and economically disadvantaged students The Umoja program actively promotes student success for all students, with an emphasis on African American student success, through culturally responsive curriculum and practices.

Under the terms of the Grant Agreement, the role of fiscal agent requires that, as directed by the CCCCO staff assigned to oversee this program, we create and implement contracts with vendors for data collection and reporting; curriculum and program creation and distribution; event planning and facilitation; and technology purchases. We will also be awarding mini-grants to Umoja-affiliated colleges throughout the state as awarded through a request for proposal (RFP) offering.
