Acceptance of a Grant Sub-Agreement between Solano Community College District (SCCD) and Chabot-Las Positas Community College District in support of the "Business and Entrepreneurship Sector Navigator" (SCCD Award No.: 18-151-010), Las Positas College

<u>Background:</u> Las Positas College has been awarded a \$7,300 Business and Entrepreneurship Sector Navigator Grant from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office, Division of Workforce and Economic Development, to disseminate funds to community colleges to implement the "Faculty Entrepreneurship Champion Mini-grant Project," for faculty sponsored projects related to small business and entrepreneurship.

Entrepreneurs and small business owners are critical to California's economic development as contributors to innovation and new job growth. The Small Business Sector collaborates with industry and education to improve and expand business and entrepreneurial curriculum. The end result is a job-ready workforce and entrepreneurial leaders to ensure California's economic growth and global competitiveness.

Las Positas College is long overdue for an up-to-date Entrepreneurship Program. A contemporary, experiential Entrepreneurship Program will appeal to a broad audience—new graduates, continuing students, returning students, and the local community seeking professional development opportunities. The new program will attract those pursuing a degree or simply seeking to increase their knowledge and improve their skills, abilities, and competencies. Course content will help students upgrade their skills for possible career advancement and give them foundational skills to launch or expand a business.

With the Business and Entrepreneurship Sector Navigator Grant, business faculty will work with students, staff, industry experts, and business leaders to plan, write, and approve updated Entrepreneurship curriculum, which will include a work-based learning/internship component, an emphasis on the entrepreneur mindset, and classes that align with the gig economy.

Funding for the project is in the amount of \$7,300 for the funding year 2018-2019, for the period beginning November 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019, but no activities under the grant will be undertaken prior to Board approval of the agreement. The funding cannot be renewed.

Background: Las Positas College forensics team, LPC Talk Hawks, has been invited to participate in the International Forensics Association Tournament in Berlin, Germany, March 8-17, 2019. The purpose of this trip is to expose our students to the highest caliber of competition from both the United States as well as foreign institutions. The learning and cultural exposure that comes from participation at these international competitions far outweighs the educational opportunities that are provided from similar tournaments held here in the Bay Area. We continue to have competitors awarded scholarships from 4-year institutions as a direct result of their participation (and success) at this tournament.

Since 2006, the Las Positas College Talk Hawks have participated in this esteemed competition ten times, including trips to the Czech Republic, Argentina, Canada, Italy, Belgium, France, Spain, Austria, and Peru and have won many international championship awards. In 2017, the Talk Hawks had the International Champion in Persuasive Speaking and Communication Analysis and placed 2nd overall in the Community College Division. We also earned International Championships in After Dinner Speaking, Prose Interpretation, and Duo Interpretation. In 2007 and 2016, the Talk Hawks finished as the top two-year institution at the tournament. In 2009 and 2016, the Talk Hawks finished 2nd Place overall at the competition.

Board Policies 4300 (Field Trips) and 4027 (Travel Study Program), Administrative Rules and Procedures, and materials from our insurance broker have been reviewed. The District is in compliance with each of these and has secured all necessary and required waivers.

<u>Background</u>: This is new clinical affiliation for educational health programs. In the past we have approved other clinical facilities like Alzheimer's of East Bay, and Pathways, and George Mark Hospice Care. This facility would provide practical clinical experience for students of the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District in educational health programs.

Requirements of the programs are for students to gain clinical experiences outside the standard classroom setting. This contract meets all programmatic accreditor's requirements for clinical facilities for the Health Programs. As a contribution to community health education, Angels Hospice would like to continue to provide students the opportunity to gain practical clinical experiences at their Facility. The Facility will continue to be an active partner in supporting healthcare education through the provision of clinical placements for healthcare education program students from Chabot College and Las Positas College for a five-year agreement; December 5, 2018 through December 31, 2023 unless terminated within 30 days by either party.

Approval of Amendment to the California Department of Education Contract for the California State Preschool Program, Chabot-Las Positas Community College

District (Contract No. CSPP-8007: Amendment 01)

<u>Background:</u> On July 17, 2018, the Board of Trustees approved Contract CSPP-8007 with the California Department of Education for the California State Preschool Program to provide Early Childhood Education Services at the Chabot ECD Lab School and Las Positas ECD Lab School. Funds support the Child Development State Preschool Program, which provides preschool services for eligible student and community families. The Children's Center also provides a critical link in facilitating and enhancing early childhood teacher education efforts by providing a working model to reflect best practices in the field.

Chabot-Las Positas Community College District has received an unsolicited augmentation from 49.10 Maximum Rate per child day of enrollment to \$51.84 Maximum Rate per child day of enrollment. The augmented amount brings the total for the period beginning July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019 to \$759,985.

Approval of Agreement with the California Department of Education for the California Early Childhood Mentor Program, and associated subcontracts with Community Colleges, Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot College

Background: The California Early Childhood Mentor Program has been contracted under the California Department of Education for 22 years. The Mentor Program was developed at Chabot in 1988 with the support of private foundations. It relocated to City College of San Francisco (CCSF) in 2001 but moved back to Chabot on August 1, 2013. The program offers a unique strategy to improve the quality of early care and education through building a mechanism to train and retain qualified staff.

The program selects and provides advanced training to experienced ECE teachers and Directors who become Mentors. Mentor teachers then earn stipends for using their classroom as an environment to train student teachers. Director mentors work with current or aspiring Early Childhood Directors to enhance the leadership and program quality in the field. The student teachers earn community college, university or high school credit for a practicum completed under the guidance of the Mentor. Both the availability of compensation and ongoing training contribute to improving the quality of early care and education in the mentor's and the student teacher's classrooms.

The program makes it possible for early childhood students to complete their Practicum course (included in the Curriculum Alignment Project's (CAP) Lower Division Eight). The Practicum course is part of the degrees offered by all 104 partner community colleges. The Board of Trustees has previously approved this contract and its accompanying subcontracts beginning April 16, 2013 and subsequently each year since the agreement came back in 2013 with Chabot College, Chabot-Las Positas Community College District acting as the lead fiscal agent. The agreement authorizes Chabot College, Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, to subcontract with 104 California Community Colleges. The subcontracts are in accordance with the program details and budget outlined in the award. A template of the subcontract has been attached for review and approval.

This agreement is being executed as of December 5, 2018 for the contract term of August 1, 2018-June 30, 2020. The amount of this agreement is not to exceed \$5,842,590.00 and authorizes CLPCCD-Chabot College to subcontract with 104 California Community Colleges to satisfy the terms of the agreement.

Approval of Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) – Umoja Community,

Education Foundation of California, Chabot College

<u>Background:</u> The purpose of this agreement is to partner with the Umoja Community Education Foundation to serve as a critical resource dedicated to enhancing the cultural and educational experiences of African American and other educationally disadvantaged students. Umoja will provide Statewide Summer Learning Institute to train with faculty from different Community Colleges on best practices in regards to serving students of color and provide ongoing training.

This MOU sets forth the relationship and obligations between Umoja Community Education Foundation, a California nonprofit benefit corporation, also known as the Umoja Community Colleges and Chabot College effective from the date signed through June 30, 2019 and will automatically renew for subsequent one-year terms for no more than five years, unless terminated at an earlier date.

- b. Increase within the district by 35 percent the number of students transferring annually to a UC or CSU.
- c. Decrease the average number of units accumulated by students earning an associate's degree in the district to 79 or fewer.
- d. Increase to 76 percent or more, the percent of career education (CTE) students who report being employed in their field of study upon exiting a college in the district.
- e. Reduce equity gaps across all of the above measures by 40 percent with the goal of fully closing those achievement gaps within 10 years.
- 3. The Chabot-Las Positas Community College District further commits it will participate in state and regional efforts to eliminate regional achievement gaps across the Vision for Success measures.
- 4. In establishing its 5-year local goals, the District demonstrates its alignment with the system wide Vision for Success goals by matching them.
- 5. The 5-year local goals will be integrated into the District's Strategic Priorities and thus will be part of the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District Comprehensive Plan, informing other district and college goals and plans.
- 6. The annually developed District Budget will continue to be aligned with the District Comprehensive Plan, including the 5-year local Vision for Success goals as integrated into the District's Strategic Priorities.
