<u>Background:</u> Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College recommends not renewing the current agreement #30020 with the Greater East Bay District of the Department of Rehabilitation (DOR) upon its conclusion on June 30, 2019.

Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College has entered into consecutive 3-year contracts with the DOR and has determined that it is no longer financially viable to continue participation in such a contract. Unfortunately, the DOR has not been able to refer the sufficient number of clients as noted on the contract, the clients have not matriculated as credit students at Las Positas College, and it is not fiscally prudent given the anticipated fiscal implications of the new Student Centered Funding Formula for the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District.

Positas Community College District, Las Positas College

<u>Background</u>: As part of the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College's goals to increase transfer and degree completion and reduce equity gaps for traditionally underrepresented students as outlined in the 2017-2019 Integrated (Unified) Plan for Student Success & Support Program (SSSP), Student Equity, and Basic Skills, the college plans to sponsor a Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU) tour.

The Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College requests to enter into an agreement with "Stepping in the Right Direction" to coordinate the tour from March 25, 2019 through March 29, 2019 for travel to Florida and Georgia. The trip includes campus tours of: Albany State University, Bethune-Cookman University, Clark Atlanta University, Edward Waters College, Florida A&M University, Morehouse College, and Spelman College.

Included in the tour arrangements are college campus tours, roundtrip airfare, ground transportation, hotel accommodations, meals, cultural excursions, HBCU tour t-shirt, backpack, and workbook. Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College plans to send up to twenty (20) students and two (2) chaperones. The total cost of the trip is not to exceed \$37,800, which will be paid with Student Equity and Achievement (SEA) program funds.

Approve the Award of a Piggyback Contract for Printer/Multi-Function Device

through U.S. Communities and CollegeBuys, Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: District Staff is preparing for the purchase, delivery and installation of Printer/Multi-Function Devices for Chabot College. These devices will replace the production printing equipment in the Chabot College Reprographics Center, which is outdated. Equipment parts are becoming unavailable and the new devices will improve reliability and efficiency while utilizing newer technology.

Under Public Contract Code section 20652, the governing board of any community college district, without advertising for bids, and when that Board has determined that it is the best interests of the District, may authorize by contract to purchase materials and equipment utilizing piggyback-able contracts.

U.S. Communities is a government cooperative purchasing resource allowing Pailicipating Public Agencies to make available their negotiated agreements to other Participating Public Agencies. U.S. Communities' contract planned for this purchase is the Multi-Function Devices and Related Services contract number 4400003732, awarded by the County of Fairfax, Virginia to Ricoh Americas Corporation. The contract period is February 11, 2013 through June 30, 2016, with Six (6) one-year renewals, or any combination thereof.

The CollegeBuys Purchasing Program is a cooperative purchasing program made available by the Foundation for California Community Colleges. The CollegeBuys contract planned for this use is the administrative services agreement awarded to Ricoh USA. This piggyback-able contract utilizes a previously conducted bidding process and contract award to the Foundation for California Community College Consortium Member Schools.

<u>Recommended Action:</u> That the Board of Trustees approve the award of a piggyback contract for the Printer/Multi-Function Devices to Ricoh USA, not to exceed \$366,880.00. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services to execute the purchase order on behalf of the District.

<u>Background</u>: On April 19, 2016, the Board of Trustees authorized to enter into an agreement with ABC Inspections, Inc. to provide Division of State Architect (DSA) Inspection Services for the New Academic Classroom Building 100, Las Positas College. The IOR contract is adjusted to accommodate extended DSA reviews and include close out activities for the New Academic Building.

This upcoming project requires a Division of State Architect (DSA) Class 1 Inspector as a requirement of Division of State Architect (DSA) and the Field Act. The extended schedule's estimated fee for these inspection services is \$14,960. The funding is contained in the budget of the project.

Approval of Award of Contract with ATI Architects + Engineers for Design and

Engineering Services for the Relocation of MPOE, Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: The District issued a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) B-18 on September 5, 2017, seeking qualified Architectural and Engineering (A/E) Services firms for Measure A Projects. Following established procurement procedures, a Pre-Qualified list of Architectural and Engineer Services Firms was established and solicited, no firm responded to this specific RFP.

Per Public Contract Code section 20111/20651 states, however, that its provisions do not apply to "professional services or advice, insurance services, or any other purchase or service otherwise exempt from this section." As noted above, contracts for special services and advice under Government Code section 53060 do not require bidding.

The District engaged negotiations for services of ATI Architects + Engineers for the MPOE Project at Chabot College. This project renovates a major portion of the first floor of Building 300 to serve the current and future capacity for telephone and internet connectivity and to provide new space for new Distributed Antenna Systems (DAS) for cell phone signal improvement at the campus. Based upon the negotiations, we request Board approval of a contract for professional services with ATI Architects + Engineers for the above project.

Approximate Construction Value: \$1,500,000 Contract Value Not To Exceed: \$224,295

Acceptance of Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) - United Way Bay Area,

District-Economic Development, Tri-Valley Career Center

<u>Background:</u> The Tri-Valley Career Center (TVCC) has again been selected to service as a Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) site to assist community members with free tax preparation and filing.

TVCC services as the site host, coordinates the program and recruits, trains and certifies volunteers to serve as tax preparers. This year, services will be offered at the TVCC location, the Pleasanton Library, and Las Positas College. Taxes are electronically filed from late January through April 15. The program has grown substantially in the last few years.

United Way Bay Area awarded a grant of \$13,000 to offset the cost of serving as a VITA site. There is also the potential of incentive funds for \$500-\$1,000 for an increase in returns filed. The grant period is January 16, 2019-June 30, 2019. The grant is paid in two parts in February and June.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approve the proposed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) and grand funding from the United Way of the Bay Area to the District-Economic Development, Tri-Valley Career Center, in the amount of \$13,000, for the period of January 16, 2019 through June 30, 2019. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the MOU on behalf of the District.
