Approval of Agreement for 2019-2020 - College and Career Access Pathways Partnership Agreement for Dual Enrollment between Hayward Unified School District and Chabot Las-Positas Community College District, Chabot College

Background: The purpose of this College and Career Access Pathways (CCAP) Partnership Agreement is to provide high school students in Hayward Unified School District an opportunity to earn early college credit at Chabot College while enrolled in high school. The intent is to offer and expand dual enrollment opportunities. These course offerings are consistent with the provisions of AB 288 (Education Code § 76004), for high school students "who may not already be college bound or who are underrepresented in higher education. The goals are: a.) to develop seamless pathways from high school to community college for career technical education or preparation for transfer b.) improve high school graduation rates c.) assist high school pupils to achieve college and career readiness d.) to serve "underachieving students", those from groups underrepresented in postsecondary education, those who are seeking advanced studies while in high school, and those seeking a career technical education credential or certificate.

These students who earn early college credit are more likely to earn high school diplomas, to enroll in community colleges and four-year colleges, to attend post-secondary education on a full-time basis, and to complete degrees in those institutions than students without these experiences.

The Board of Trustees approved the form and language of the CLPCCD CCAP Agreement at the July 9, 2016 meeting, Agenda Item 4.3.

CCAP Agreements must be presented at two public (informational and adoption) meetings in the review and approval of the Agreement. This Board Agenda item serves as the second presentation and request for approval and adoption.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed agreement for 2019-2020 with College and Career Access Pathways Partnership Agreement for Dual Enrollment between Hayward Unified School District and Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot College. <u>Background:</u> Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College has a successful Engineering Technology Learning Community that provides support services to students as they pursue their educational and career goals. Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College is considered a partner college in the National Science Foundation (NSF) INCLUDES Alliance STEM Core Expansion project. This agreement allows Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College to receive financial support not to exceed \$15,000 for services, and to receive travel reimbursement related to the support of students in the Engineering Technology Learning Community.

<u>Background:</u> On August 21, 2018, the Board of Trustees approved the agreement with the City of Hayward to continue the work with the Chabot College Student Initiative Center (SIC) on supporting the development of its Vision Plan while extending the work to include gathering community input about the City's water-related issues.

In collaboration with City of Hayward staff, project staff will design and conduct interviews for gathering input, produce materials for a knowledge fair, collect and produce a presentation and photos/video of outreach activities and community input, and organize community activities.

The City of Hayward would like to amend the agreement and issue \$22,000 of additional funding to develop a transparent and community-led process to select at least two community-led projects to be funded through the City's Neighborhood Improvement Partnership grant program; assist with project implementation and documentation, with the consistent inclusion of South Hayward community members and City staff; coordinate with Start Up East Bay to run a startup weekend to assist with the projects; document work, including photos, videos, and testimonials and participate in bi-weekly progress report phone calls with City of Hayward staff.

Total compensation for services and expenses incurred shall not exceed \$22,000 for the Scope of Work described in Exhibit E. Funding will be in the amount of \$22,000 for the period of July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019.

Approval of Non-Renewal of Agreement between California Community Colleges, Foster & Kinship Care Education (FKCE) and Chabot-Las Positas

Community College District, Las Positas College

<u>Background</u>: Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College recommends not renewing the current agreement with the California Community Colleges, Foster & Kinship Care Education (FKCE) upon its conclusion of fiscal year 2018-2019 on June 30, 2019.

Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College has entered into yearly agreements with the California Community Colleges, Foster & Kinship Care Education (FKCE) and has determined that it is no longer financially viable to continue participation in such an agreement. Unfortunately, the program experienced a cut of about 7%, or \$600,000, statewide for fiscal year 2018-2019 and expects a \$900,000 statewide cut for 2019-2020, and it is not fiscally prudent given the anticipated fiscal implications of the new Foster & Kinship Care Education (FKCE) allocation model for the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approve the Non-Renewal of Agreement with California Community Colleges, Foster & Kinship Care Education (FKCE) and Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College upon its conclusion of fiscal year 2018-2019 on June 30, 2019. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to initiate the notification process on behalf of the District.

College

Background: Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot College has been a satellite location supporting Technician Training Programs for Raytheon Professional Services through the College's Automotive Technology Program since 2014. Approval of this agreement renewal would continue the Instructor Facilitated Training classes and Certification assessments performed at this satellite location. Training classes involve facilitation/ coaching as well as teaching/lecturing on technology/theory. The objective of these classes is to assure technicians understand the concepts of diagnostic procedures and apply these procedures to make correct repairs on vehicles. Raytheon Professional Services LLC desires to continue use of Chabot College's automotive facilities to conduct training classes for their technicians. Classes will be taught for specified days or a time frame of days based upon mutual agreement.

This is an extension of the original technical services agreement (TSA) that ran from May 17, 2017 through December 31, 2019. The term of this agreement is from December 31, 2019 through March 31, 2020. Chabot College will receive a facility rate of \$415.00 for each day used.

Approval of Agreement Renewal between Stanford Health Care - ValleyCare and

Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College

<u>Background</u>: Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College has received an agreement renewal with Stanford Health Care - ValleyCare to operate the Student Health and Wellness Center at Las Positas College for an annual fee of \$306,665 (2019-20) and \$315,225 (2020-21) for the period of June 1, 2019 through May 31, 2021.

Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College has a working relationship with Stanford Health Care - ValleyCare since 1998. The Student Health and Wellness Center provides health care services including non-emergency medical care, health care guidance, medical referral services and preventive health care services. Basic expenditure costs for the Student Health and Wellness Center cover the full-time nurse practitioner, part-time Office Assistant, and part time Medical Assistant and medical supplies.
