The WFPG funds will be applied in accordance with the Workforce Advising area of service as outlined and required by ACOE and the DSS. Specifically, this will support increased learning and healthy development of California's young children by increasing the number of qualified early learning and care professionals, and increasing the educational credentials, knowledge and competencies of existing early learning and care professionals across the state.

19-24, 2022 to Attend the All African Diaspora Education Summit

Background: The All African Diaspora Education Summit 2022, sponsored by the A2MEND California organization, and hosted at the University of Cape Coast, will allow participants to: build partnerships across the diaspora with Black educators and Black educational institutions, learn pedagogical values embedded in the African way of life, exchange curriculum and practices, contribute to a global think-tank of Pan-Africanists to advise African leaders and organizations both home and abroad, and explore educational exchange programs to support Las Positas College's Global Studies Program. The Summit brings together educational practitioners and students from around the world to work together to develop innovative and collaborative approaches to support Black student success.

Attendance at this Summit is aligned with the Las Positas College Educational Master Plan, Goal E: Equity and Anti-Racism, which is to establish Las Positas College as a destination campus for Black students and other students of color by nurturing culturally-informed and equity-focused curriculum, strengthening access to support services, and creating physical and virtual cultural centers.

As faculty, Danielle Odom and Salem Admassu serve as Umoja program co-coordinators, Eric Bell serves as the coordinator of the LPC Brother 2 Brother program, and Tracey Coleman teaches Business Law, Business Ethics & Society, and International Business and serves as the LPC Academic Senate President. All four faculty are also members of the College's Black Educators Association (BEA). The Summit will allow the faculty, in their respective capacities, to further enhance culturally-informed program and curriculum development for students.

Acceptance of Grant Award Agreement - Kaiser Permanente Northern

California Community Benefit Programs, Chabot College: Cal Fresh

Recruitment Program (138797)

Background: CalFresh enrollment is an important aspect of supporting basic financial stability. While some students benefit from Chabot College's food pantry services, this is often not enough. CalFresh enrollment can serve as a much more sustainable and stable means for addressing food insecurity, with the food pantry supplementing this resource. Grant objectives focus on increasing student enrollment in CalFresh and the CalFresh Employment & Training (E&T) Program, as part of the services provided by the new Chabot College SparkPoint Center comprehensive resource hub.

The CalFresh Employment & Training Program will target special program students, particularly RISE (formerly incarcerated) and Guardian Scholar students in the Welding, Medical Assisting, Machine Tool, and Industrial Technology Electronics Career Technical Education (CTE) programs. Funding supports enrolling students in CalFresh programs and provides students with basic needs support (e.g., books, transportation, supplies, tools, uniforms, etc.) to ensure students have the resources they need to succeed in their education.

Funding for the project is in the amount of \$25,000 for the period of July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approve the proposed Grant Award Agreement - Kaiser Permanente Northern California Community Benefit Programs in the amount of \$25,000 for the period of July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023.
