BACKGROUND INFORMATION -

The Tiburcio Vasquez Health Clinic offers a variety of dental care for children and adults using state-of-the-art equipment. The dentists are board-certified and experienced in providing care to patients of diverse cultural backgrounds. A partnership with the Chabot College Dental Hygiene Program would provide students with experience(s) similar to private practice. In addition, the students would gain cultural competency through seeing a diverse patient population in various age groups.

An agreement with the Tiburcio Vasquez Health Clinic was recently approved at the February 17 Board of Trustees meeting as Item 4.4. Per the request of the Tiburcio Vasquez Health Clinic, the additional/changed language below has been added to the agreement.

1. In Section 2.E, the addition of the language in red was added so that the item reads as follows: The Agency shall have the right, after notifying the Program Coordinator, to terminate the participation of any student for failure to abide by its rules, regulations, and policies subject to each program's due process procedures. *If a student's enrollment in the academic program at the District is discontinued for any reason (expulsion, student decision to leave, etc.), the District must immediately notify the Agency and inform the student that they can no longer participate in the clinical education experience at the Agency.*
2. In Section 3.H, the revisions in red were added so that the item reads as follows: The District shall ensure that student meets the following credentialing and privileging criteria:
 - o 1. Complete TVHC Volunteer packet
 - o 2. Background check
 - o 3. Annual TB Clearance (PPD, QuantiFERON or Chest Xray within 5 years)
 - o 4. Verification of immune status for MMR, Varicella, Tdap, Hepatitis B, Flu, COVID-19
 - o 5. Current *American Heart Association/American Red Cross Basic Life Support (BLS) Certification-CPR Card*
 - o 6. Fitness for Duty
 - o 7. Government-Issued Photo ID
 - o 8. *Resume*
 - o 9. *Highest Education Diploma/Transcript*
 - o 10. *Respirator Fit Test Certification*
 - o 11. *Professional License, Certificate or Registration (if applicable)*

BACKGROUND INFORMATION -

- Chabot-Las Positas Community College District (CLPCCD) was awarded a grant by the Regents of the University of California on behalf of the Puente project to support the Puente program at Las Positas College. This was approved by the CLPCCD Board of Trustees on July 18, 2023.
- The mission of the Puente Project is to increase the number of educationally underrepresented students who enroll in four-year colleges and universities, earn degrees, and return to the community as leaders and mentors to future generations. The first Puente Project was initiated at Chabot College in 1981. Since that time, the model has been replicated at 74 colleges and 34 high schools throughout the State of California, with the oversight of the Puente Project centralized through the Regents of the University of California. The Puente Project was established in 2012-13 between the University of California and Chabot-Las Positas College, Las Positas College.
- The Puente Math and Science Program known as Puente MAS Program was piloted at LPC in 2022. It allowed the addition of the math component to its current model. The previous model of the Puente program was English, Counseling, and Mentoring. The model now has four components English, Math, Counseling, and Mentoring. The Puente M^AS program at LPC has been implemented successfully at Las Positas College since 2023.
- With this amendment, the Regents will provide additional support to Puente students for the 2025-26 fiscal year, and an augmented amount of \$125,000 as additional support for the Puente program at Las Positas College. There is no expenditure deadline for these funds or other Puente program funds previously issued.

The District owns 400 acres of real property land in the City of Livermore for the purpose of preserving and restoring the grassland, blue oak woodlands and other natural ecological features found there. A portion of the property is being managed according to a Habitat Mitigation and Management Plan (HMMP) approved by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Services. According to HMMP, managed grazing is beneficial to the use of the Property by listed species. The land is open with grass and the District would incur the cost of plowing the open grass to reduce the fire danger to the Las Positas College. The District has negotiated with 7M Cattle Company of Livermore to lease such portion of the Property for pulsed cattle grazing within certain fenced areas when grazing is determined to be necessary in accordance with the HMMP. Amendment 01 extends the term of the PLA for an additional five (5) years and updates key provisions related to governance, dispute resolution, and project coverage.
