<u>Chabot College Student Success and Support Program (SSSP)</u> <u>Quarterly Report</u>

The Board has requested that each college provide a quarterly update on our work in achieving the goals and objectives set forth in meeting the Student Success and Support Program initiative (SSSP). The following is an update on Chabot's progress in meeting these mandates. In 2012, lead by the Chabot Planning, Review, and Budget Council, Chabot's study of student success generated the college's strategic plan goal to "increase the number of students that achieve their educational goal within a reasonable time by clarifying pathways and providing more information and support." Meeting this goal requires enhanced collaboration between support programs that have traditionally been somewhat "siloed." In academic year 2012-2013, we worked to coordinate student services and academic services across disciplines and areas to develop pathways and support students to succeed in reaching their goals.

Chabot's Pathways and First Year Experience program incorporates a number of high-Impact educational practices, identified by the American Association of College and Universities (AAC&U) and other research organizations as increasing deep learning, success, and persistence. High-impact practices include first-year seminars and experience, learning communities, writing-Intensive courses, collaborative assignments, service learning (community-based learning), undergraduate research, capstone courses and projects ("High Impact Practices: What they are, Who Has Access to Them, and Why They Matter," AAC&U, https://www.aacu.org/sites/default/files/files/hip_tables.pdf).)

This work has required collaboration between Student and Academic support services to foster community and provide the support students need from the start of their time at Chabot to the end, and includes high school outreach, assessment, orientation, early completion of basic skills, collaborative learning and community or service based learning, and career and transfer. Its central academic feature is a defined pathway to completion of lower-division college requirements.

Initial data for fall 2014 indicates that our current pilots support many students from underserved communities, those identified as target populations in our Equity and Student Success initiatives.

Post Census Demographic Data for Current Fall Semester 2014 First year Experience/Pathways Students (including Puente and Daraja):

- 47 % of FYE students are Latino (compared to 44 % of all new students)
- 22% of FYE students are African American (compared to 11 % of all new students)
- 2% of FYE students are Pacific Islanders (compared to 2% all new students)
- 76% of FYE students are in need of Basic Skills support (compared to 85% of all new students)

Total: 86 students are taking multiple courses in a new FYE/Pathway (Business, STEM, Social Justice, Athletics); **166 students** in all existing pathways, counting Puente and Daraja

Features of Integrated Student Support for First Year Experience /Pathways:

- In-person orientation
- Educational Planning
- Embedded Math support
- Peer Mentoring
- Basic skills course completion by the end of the first year
- Contextualized English

Of note is FYE's focus on Basic Skills completion. Chabot and national data confirms that students who do not complete basic skills in their first year do not persist or succeed at the rates of those who either test into college level course and/or complete basic skills courses within their first year. 85% of Chabot students test into basic skills. After two years, 88% of students who test into college English have enrolled in an English 1A, while only 48% of FT and 18% of PT basic skills students have *enrolled* (not completed) 1A.

Goals and Objectives" Completion and Persistence Studies

Our first cohorts of First year Experience/Pathways students have not yet completed one semester! As we complete our first semester of FYE/ Pathways offerings, our Office of Institutional Research will be studying the outcomes for student success in persistence and completion of First Year Experience students as compared to non-First Year Experience control groups. We will be reporting on a quarterly basis regarding emergent data.
