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APPLICATION ABSTRACT

The Chabot-Las Positas Community College District (CLPCCD) has had major contracts and grants for many years – many having multiple stakeholders. Our department of Economic Development and Contract Education, the most successful in terms of revenue generation in the California Community College system for the last nine years has administered over \$52 million in contracts during that period.

We have experience with administering and serving as a fiscal agent for both relatively small projects with a few contractors, as well as for major multi-million dollar contracts that require subcontracts of over a million dollars each. We have vendor relationships throughout the state and the Western Region and are comfortable with multiple projects needing oversight concurrently.
