MESSAGE FROM THE CHANCELLOR

On March 2, 2004, the voters of the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District (CLPCCD) approved a bond measure to implement a capital improvement program for Chabot College in Hayward and Las Positas College in Livermore. Your vote for Measure B, the \$498 million dollar bond, allowed the district to repair leaky roofs, worn wiring, and plumbing; renovate aging, deteriorating classrooms and libraries; and repair, acquire, construct, and equip college buildings and computer labs.

Measure B, now in its final phase of funding, allowed our college campuses to be updated with award-winning facilities and improvements that have achieved some of the highest sustainability standards and are saving hundreds of thousands of dollars in annual energy costs. Two of the last projects to be built under Measure B will be a new biology building for Chabot College and a new academic classroom building for Las Positas College.

Now, with your generous support of Measure A passed on June 7, 2016, we will be able to continue to upgrade Chabot and Las Positas Colleges. The \$950 million dollar bond measure will enable us to continue preparing students, veterans and workers for good paying jobs and transfer to four-year universities.

Measure A will:

- Upgrade classrooms and labs for science, technology, engineering and math-related fields to better prepare students for good-paying jobs
- Retrofit buildings to improve earthquake safety
- \bullet Improve support facilities and educational resources for veterans
- Improve and maintain classrooms and labs for career preparation in fields like healthcare and early childhood education
- Improve access to facilities for those with disabilities

The CLPCCD extends our sincerest appreciation to the Measure B Citizens' Oversight Committee, which monitors district Measure B expenditures. The same oversight committee structure will continue for Measure A.












MEASURE B 2016 PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS









LAS POSITAS COLLEGE

New Academic Classroom Building

Construction is underway for the new Academic Classroom Building 100. The 41,000 square foot, two-story, steel framed building consists of 12 classrooms, 6 computer labs, an anthropology lab and a large lecture hall. Construction is scheduled to be complete in May 2018.

CHABOT COLLEGE

New Biology Building

Design is complete for the new Biology Building at Chabot College. The 19,600 square foot, two-story, steel framed building consists of 5 biology laboratories, associated support spaces and a greenhouse. Construction is scheduled to begin September 2017.

DISTRICT SAVES TAXPAYERS..

In a strategic move designed to take advantage of historic low interest rates, the CLPCCD has refinanced \$247 million in existing bond debt. This bond refinancing saves District taxpayers approximately \$408 million in future tax payments on Measure B, which is equivalent to approximately \$186 million in today's dollars.
