PDE *Total Energy Solutions* is pleased to submit an electrical implementation proposal for the project referenced above. Our proposal is based upon Architectural Drawings prepared by SimonGlover dated 4/4/17, Sheet S-1 prepared by Bushra-Tsai Incorporated dated March, 2017, Electrical drawings prepared by Gausman & Moore dated 5/17/17, the following scope of work:

Civil Construction

- 1. Grub the area of construction two remove two (2) trees approximately 4" in diameter as per the plan.
- 2. Relocate existing storm drain outside of the new pad location.
- 3. Remove seven (7) existing bollards and turn over to the College.
- 4. Trench for underground conduit approximately 180 linear feet. Trenches to be 42" deep and provide 6" of sand bedding below conduits, and 6" of bedding above conduits. Warning tape to be placed on top of final lift of sand. Total conduit soil/sand coverage shall be at least 30".
- 5. Compact trenches using standard methods with the native soils as backfill.
- 6. Remove 12" of soil and scarify bottom of proposed pad. Spoils to be lost on site.
- 7. Provide and install 12" of Class II AB material and compact to 95% under the proposed slab
- 8. Provide and install forms and reinforcing steel according to the design.
- 9. Place 6" thick concrete pad according to design.
- 10. Off-load two (2) battery-system containers (less electrolyte) from trucks and place onto concrete pad. Transportation of containers to site is by others.
- 11. Off-load two (2) 150KVA isolation transformers and two (2) PCS cabinets and place on the concrete pad.



Electrical Construction

- 12. Shut down Panel MSB during a weekend using a High Voltage Switching contractor to lock out and ground out the substation transformer serving Panel MSB.
- 13. Retrofit the existing Eaton 2,400 amp circuit breaker and equip it with a 125VAC motor operator and spring release kit.
- 14. Provide and install one (1) 400 amp breaker and hardware kit inside Panel MSB.
- 15. Remove existing metering in MSB.
- 16. Install new isolation cubicle at MSB in the location of the former meter.
- 17. Provide and install new Schweitzer SEL relay, components, fuse blocks, shorting blocks, PT's CPT, UPS for SEL relay, UPS receptacle, and new cubicle door.
- 18. Provide all wiring of the SEL relay.
- 19. Provide two (2) days onsite for Schweitzer representatives for programming of the SEL relay.
- 20. Provide and install one (1) NEMA 3R 400 amp visible-blade disconnect.
- 21. Provide and install one (1) new Panel MG with 400 amp main circuit breaker, two (2) 200 amp distribution breakers, and one (1) revenue-grade mtere including CT's and communications features.
- 22. Provide the following conduit systems:
 - a. One (1) 4" conduit with four (4) #500KCM THHN concuctors and one (1) #3 equipment ground between MSB and the visible-blade disconnect;
 - b. Two (2) 2" conduits with pull strings from the communications vault and route one each to each PCS cabinet.
 - c. One (1) 1-1/4" conduit with five (5) #10 THHN conductors between Panel MSB and the first PCS cabinet. Extend the same conduit system between the first and second PCS cabinet.
 - d. One (1) 1-1/2" conduit with pull string between Panel MSB and the first PCS cabinet.
 - e. One (1) 1-1/4" conduit with pull string between the first MSB cabinet and Panel MG for metering communications.
 - f. One (1) 1-1/4" conduit with pull string between each PCS cabinet for Ethernet.
 - g. One (1) 2" conduit each between Panel MG and each of the isolation transformers. Conduit shall include four (4) #3/0 THHN conductors and one (1) #6 equipment grounding conductor.
 - h. One (1) each 3" conduit with three (3) #3/0 THHN conductors and one (1) #6G between the isolation transformer and each of the PCSs cabinets.
 - Two (2) each 2-1/2 GRS conduits between each PCS cabinet and each battery container. Conduits shall contain three (3) #4/0 THHN conductors and one (1) #4 equipment ground.
 - j. One (1) 3/4" GRS conduit with five (5) #12 THHN conductors between the PCS cabinet and the battery container.
 - k. One (1) 1-1/2" GRS conduit with pull string between each PCS cabinet and associated battery container.
- 23. Terminate each end of conductors we have referenced above. Torque and meg-ohm test the connections where possible and required.
- 24. Drill two (2) concrete cores into the existing communications vault.





- 25. All 90 degree conduit segments to be twice-wrapped with 10-mil PVC tape or be PVC coated, rigid steel conduit (OCAL/Rob Roy).
- 26. Provide a #3/0 Ufer ground in the new concrete pad and bond each container in one location, each isolation transformer enclosure, the visible blade disconnect, and Panel MG. Cadweld as necessary.
- 27. Provide three (3) 125V, 20 amp GFCI receptacles with FD boxes and in-use covers for service equipment around the battery. Connect to Panel LSF with 1" OCAL conduit, with three (3) #12 THHN conductors in the conduit. Provide and install one (1) 1-pole, 20 amp circuit breaker as may be required. Update the panelboard legend.
- Provide injection testing of all circuit breakers furnished by PDE which are 100 amps or larger.

- 1. Anchorage of UET supplied equipment is by others;
- Landscaping or tree replacement;
- 3. Concrete encasement of conduits and the creation of duct banks;
- 4. Fencing;

- 6. Telecommunications cabling, equipment, and programming is excluded;
- 7. Fire alarm and fire suppression systems;
- 8. Fiber Optic and Ethernet cabling, installation, terminations, and programming;
- 9. Relocation of existing underground utilities;

- 12. Storm Water Prevention Program engineering:
- 13. Permit or utility fees of any kind;

CONTRACT FOR LABOR AND MATERIALS

This Contract for Labor and Materials ("Contract") is entered into this 8th day of June, 2017 by and between CHABOT-LAS POSITAS COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT ("District") and PDE Total Energy Solutions ("Contractor") doing business at 9970 Bell Ranch Drive #109, Santa Fe Springs, CA 90670-2980 for the Work of the Project generally described as: Civil and Electrical Construction (CEC) MicroGrid Grant Project, Las Positas College. In consideration of the mutual covenants set forth herein, the Contractor and District agree as follows:

- A. In consideration of the payment of the sum of Three Hundred and Thirty-Eight Thousand, Six Hundred and Fifteen Dollars (\$338,615.00) ("the Contract Price"), the Contractor shall perform and complete the Work generally described in PDE's Proposal, dated June 2, 2017, which includes payment and performance bonds.
- B. Contractor shall commence the Work on the date indicated in the Notice to Proceed, issued by or on behalf of the District and shall complete the Work by December 30, 2017.
- C. The location of the Work is 3000 Campus Hill Drive, Livermore, CA 94551 ("the Site").
- D. At all times during the Work, the Contractor and each Subcontractor shall obtain and maintain the following insurance coverages:

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT FOR LABOR AND MATERIALS

- 1. Labor and Materials. The Contractor shall furnish and pay for all labor, materials, equipment and services necessary to complete the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents. Unless otherwise expressly provided for in the Contract Documents, all materials, equipment and other items incorporated into the Work shall be new and of the most suitable grade and quality for the purpose intended. The Work is subject to tests/inspections as required by the Contract Documents. The Contractor shall afford the District, the Project Inspector, the Architect and test/inspection services (if applicable) with access to the Work, wherever located and whether in place or in progress. All of the Work shall conform to the requirements of the Contract Documents and applicable laws, ordinances, rules and regulations.
- 2. Submittals. The Contractor shall submit to the District Representative or the Architect, as designated in the Contract Documents, shop drawings, product data and other submittals (collectively "Submittals") required by the Contract Documents promptly and in an orderly sequence while allowing sufficient time for review and comment. No portion of the Work requiring Submittals shall be performed until the required Submittals have been reviewed and accepted.
- 3. Construction Schedule. If required by the District, the Contractor shall prepare a Construction Schedule in such form and format as directed by the District. The Construction Schedule shall reflect all activities necessary to complete the Work and shall be in such detail as required by the District. If a schedule is required, the Contractor shall update the schedule monthly or more frequently as directed by the District or required by the circumstances of the Work.

4. Changes.

- 4.1 Changes to the Work. The District may, by written order, make Changes to the Work, issue additional instructions and to add to or delete from the Work. No Change may be made without the prior written approval and direction of the District. Adjustments of the Contract Price or the Contract Time on account of a Change authorized hereunder will only be made by written Change Order duly executed by the Contractor and the District Representative. Adjustments to the Contract Price for authorized Changes shall be limited to the actual costs of labor and materials necessary to complete the Change plus a mark-up of 5 percent (5%) of the actual costs of labor and materials; it being agreed that the mark-up represents all compensation due the Contractor for profit, overhead/administrative costs and impacts of an authorized Change. Changes approved by the District shall be reduced to Change Order in the form and substance as set forth in Attachment A hereto.
- 4.2 Substitutions. No substitution of any specified item, product, material or system ("Specified Items") will be considered unless the Contractor submits a request to substitute Specified Items along with data substantiating the equivalency of the proposed substitution with the Specified Items not more than thirty five (35) days after the date of award of the Contract to the Contractor. The Contractor shall reimburse the District for all costs and expenses incurred by the District to review a proposed substitution for Specified Items. The District's acceptance or rejection of a proposed substitution shall be final. No substitution accepted by the District shall increase the Contract Price or the Contract Time; provided, however, if the cost to furnish/install an approved substitution is less than the specified Item, the Contract Price shall be reduced by such cost difference. If any Specified Items are identified in any portion of the Contract Documents as "District Standard Materials/Equipment" "match existing in use" or similar words/phrases, in accordance with Public Contract Code §3400, the District shall be deemed to have made a finding that such Specified Items are designated as "sole source" items designed to match

existing and in use items. In accordance with Public Contract Code §3400, the District will not consider or accept alternatives or substitutions for any Specified Items so identified.

- 5. Payment Bond; Performance Bond. Prior to commencement of Work, the Contractor shall obtain and deliver to the District a Labor and Materials Payment Bond and a Performance Bond. Bonds required hereunder will be accepted by the District only if: (a) they are in the form and content included in the Contract Documents; (b) the Bonds are issued by and Admitted Surety Insurer under California law; and (c) in a penal sum equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the Contract Price.
- 6. Safety; Security. The Contractor shall comply with all applicable laws, ordinances, rules, or regulations pertaining to safety at the Site, including without limitation, implementation and enforcement of safety programs. The Contractor shall implement and maintain safety measures such as fencing, barricades, signs, lights and other precautions to prevent injury or death to persons or damage to property, as required or appropriate by the circumstances or the nature of the Work. The Contractor is responsible for securing the Site and Work in place or in progress (including materials/equipment/tools situated at the Site) to prevent theft, loss or damage.

7. Labor.

- 7.1 Prevailing Wage Rates; Hours of Work. The Contractor and all Subcontractors shall: (a) pay their respective workers wage rates not less than the prevailing wage rate established for the classification, trade or work performed by each worker; (b) maintain complete and accurate payroll records for workers engaged in the Work; and (c) if requested by the District, provide Certified Payroll records as required by applicable laws. The Contractor and Subcontractors shall not permit any worker to provide more than eight (8) hours of work per day or forty (40) hours per week without additional compensation as mandated by law. The Contractor shall be subject to all penalties and assessments provided by law or regulation for violation(s) of the prevailing wage rate or hours of work requirements.
- **7.2 Apprentices**. Apprentices, if any engaged in performing any portion of the Work shall be in strict conformity with applicable laws, rules and regulations, including without limitation, Labor Code §§1777.5 through 1777.7, which are incorporated herein by this reference.
- 7.3 Competency and Discipline. The Contractor shall enforce strict discipline and good order among the Contractor's employees, the employees of any Subcontractor and all other persons performing any part of the Work at the Site. Personnel of the Contractor or any Subcontractor shall be subject to removal from the Site for violations of applicable law or District policies. The Contractor shall not permit employment of unfit persons or persons not skilled in tasks assigned to them and shall dismiss from its employ and direct any Subcontractor or Sub-subcontractor to dismiss from their employment any person deemed by the District to be unfit or incompetent to perform Work.
- 7.4 Superintendent. The Contractor shall employ a Superintendent fluent in verbal and written English who shall be in attendance at the Site at all times during performance of Work at the Site. The Superintendent shall be deemed the Contractor's Representative for the Work; directions, instructions or other communications to or with the Contractor's Superintendent shall be deemed directions, instructions or communications to or with the Contractor.
- 8. Subcontractors. The Work of each Subcontractor shall be set forth in a written Subcontract agreement incorporating by reference this Contract; Subcontracts shall be made available to the District for review upon request of the District. The Contractor is responsible to the District for the acts, omissions and other conduct of Subcontractors. Each Subcontractor shall maintain annual

- compliance with Senate Bill 854 and Workers Compensation/Employers Liability Insurance and Commercial General Liability Insurance as required by the Contract for Labor and Materials.
- 9. Non-Discrimination. The Contractor and its Subcontractors shall not discriminate against any active or prospective employee based upon race, color, ancestry, national origin, religion, sex, age, sexual preference or marital status. The Contractor and its Subcontractors shall comply with all applicable laws, ordinances, rules and regulations prohibiting workplace discrimination and/or discriminatory employment practices.
- 10. Payment of the Contract Price. The District will make payment of the Contract Price upon completion of the Work, the Contractor's full performance of all other obligations under this Contract and the Contractor's submission of a properly itemized invoice. Upon receipt of the Contractor's invoice, the District Representative will promptly verify that the Work has been completed and that the Contractor has performed all other obligations hereunder. Within thirty (30) days of the District Representative's confirmation of the completion of Work and the Contractor's performance of other obligations hereunder, the District will make payment of the Contract Price. If the Contract Time is a duration of sixty (60) days or more, the Contractor may submit invoices on a monthly basis for the value of Work completed in the prior month, whereupon the District Representative will promptly verify that the Work has been completed as indicated in the Contractor's invoice. Within thirty (30) days of the date of such verification, the District will make payment equal to ninety-five percent (95%) of the value of the Work completed. Within sixty (60) days of completion of all Work and all other of the Contractor's obligations hereunder, amounts previously retained from prior invoices will be released to the Contractor. The District may, in its sole discretion, condition payment of the Contract Price, or any portion thereof, upon: (a) the Contractor's preparation of a Schedule of Values for review and acceptance by the District's Representative; (b) the submittal of executed Waivers and Releases (on Progress Payment or Final Payment, as applicable) for the Contractor and all Subcontractors receiving any portion of the Contract Price; and/or (c) delivery of Certified Payroll records of the Contractor and Subcontractors. The District may withhold payment of the Contract Price if: (a) there are claims or the probability of claims being submitted by Subcontractor, Material Suppliers or others in connection with the Work; (b) defective or non-conforming Work which is not remedied; or (c) there are any uncured Contractor defaults. Notwithstanding any provision of the Contract Documents to the contrary, no payment will be made to the Contractor upon completion of the Work unless the Contractor has completed and submitted the form of Asbestos and Other Hazardous Materials Certification set forth in Attachment B hereto.
- 11. Insurance. The Contractor and its Subcontractors shall, at all times during the Work, maintain Workers Compensation, Employers Liability, and Commercial General Liability Insurance in the minimum coverage amounts set forth in the Contract. The Contractor's Commercial General Liability Insurance shall name the District as an Additional Insured. The Contractor shall maintain a policy of Builders Risk Insurance covering the full insurable value of the Work; if noted as a requirement in the Contract, the Builder's Risk Insurance shall include seismic coverage. All policies of insurance shall include provisions that the policy of insurance will not be materially modified, cancelled or allowed to expire without at least thirty (30) days advance notice to the District. Prior to commencing the Work, the Contractor shall deliver Certificates of Insurance of itself and its Subcontractors evidencing the required insurance coverages. No Work at the Site by the Contractor or any Subcontractor will be permitted unless the Contractor and Subcontractor, as applicable has/have submitted Certificates of Insurance evidencing the required insurance policies hereunder to the District Representative.

- 12. Drug Free Workplace Certificate. In accordance with California Government Code §§8350 et seq., the Drug Free Workplace Act of 1990, the qualified Contractor will be required to execute a Drug Free Workplace Certificate concurrently with execution of the Labor and Material Contract. The qualified Contractor will be required to implement and take the affirmative measures outlined in the Drug Free Workplace Certificate and in California Government Code §§8350 et seq. Failure of the qualified Contractor to comply with the measures outlined in the Drug Free Workplace Certificate and in California Government Code §§8350 et seq. may result in penalties, including without limitation, the termination of the Contract, the suspension of any payment of the Contract Price otherwise due under the Contract Documents and/or debarment of the qualified Contractor.
- 13. Workers' Compensation Insurance. Pursuant to California Labor Code §3700, the qualified Contractor shall secure Workers' Compensation Insurance for its employees engaged in the Work of the Contract. The qualified Contractor shall sign and deliver to the District the form of Workers Compensation Insurance included with the Contract Documents.
- Public Works Contractor Registration Certificate. Pursuant to California Senate Bill 854, the qualified Contractor shall be registered with the California's Department of Industrial Relations (DIR) and its subcontractors who intend to bid or perform work on any public works project, as defined under Labor Code Section 1720. The qualified Contractor shall sign and deliver to the District the form of Public Works Contractor Registration Certification included with the Contract Documents.
- 15. Indemnification. Unless arising solely out of the active negligence or willful misconduct of the District, the Contractor shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the District, the District's Board of Trustees and all members thereof and the District's employees, officers, agents and representatives from all claims, demands and liabilities, including without limitation, attorneys fees, which arise out of or related in any manner to this Contract or the Work. The Contractor's obligations hereunder include without limitation: (a) injury to, or death of, persons; (b) damage to property; (c) theft or loss of property; (d) Stop Notice claims; and (e) other losses, damages or costs arising out of, in whole or in part, of the acts, omissions or other conduct of the Contractor or Subcontractors. The Contractor's obligations hereunder shall survive termination of the Contract and/or completion of the Work, and are deemed incorporated into and made a part of the obligations of the Surety issuing the Performance Bond.
- 16. District Right to Terminate. The Contractor's failure to comply with any term or condition of the Contract Documents shall constitute default of the Contractor; in such event, the District may terminate the Contract upon seven (7) days written notice to the Contractor. Unless the Contractor shall have commenced, and diligently thereafter prosecute to completion, all required actions to cure such default(s), this Contract shall be deemed terminated without further action of the District; such termination shall be effective the seventh (7th) day after the date of the District's written notice. If the District terminates the Contract for default of the Contractor, the Contractor and the Performance Bond Surety shall be liable to the District for all losses, costs and damages arising out of the Contractor's default and costs to complete the Work which exceeds the remaining Contract Price at the time of termination. In addition to the preceding, the District may terminate this Contract at any time for the convenience of the District by written notice to the Contractor, in which case, the payment of the Contract Price shall be limited to the value of the Work in place or in progress at the time of the termination for the District's convenience.
- **17. Warranty**. If within one (1) year, or such other period set forth in the Contract Documents, any of the Work or workmanship is found defective or not in compliance with the Contract Documents, the Contractor shall upon the District's demand, promptly take all measures necessary to correct,

repair or replace such Work or workmanship. If the Contractor fails to do so, the District may take necessary action to correct, replace or repair such Work or workmanship at the cost and expense of the Contractor. The surety issuing the Performance Bond shall be liable to the District for correction, repair or replacement of defective/non-conforming Work if the Contractor fails or refuses to perform in accordance with the preceding.

18. Tests/Inspections of the Work. The Work shall be subject to tests/inspections as required by the Contract Documents. The Contractor shall be liable excessive costs of tests/inspections which result from the Work not being ready for tests/inspections or the failure of the Work to comply with the applicable test/inspection standards. If the Work is subject to the jurisdiction of the Division of State Architect ("DSA"), all of the Work shall be subject to inspection/observation by the Project Inspector retained by the District under DSA regulations. The Project Inspector shall have access at all times to the Work, whether in place or in progress; the Contractor shall provide such access without adjustment of the Contract Price or the Contract Time.

19. Miscellaneous.

- 19.1 Disputes. Each dispute or claim of \$375,000 or less arising out of this Contract shall be resolved in accordance with Public Contract Code §20104 et seq. A dispute or claim exceeding \$375,000 shall be resolved by binding arbitration conducted under the auspices of the American Arbitration Association and its Construction Industry Arbitration Rules in effect at the time that a Demand for Arbitration is filed, except as modified herein. The award rendered by the Arbitrator(s) ("Arbitration Award") shall be final and binding upon the District and the Contractor only if the Arbitration Award is supported by applicable law and substantial evidence pursuant to California Code of Civil Procedure §1296 and includes findings of fact and conclusions of law in conformity with California Code of Civil Procedure §1296 and Rule R-43 of the AAA Construction Industry Arbitration Rules. Any Arbitration Award that does not conform to the foregoing shall be invalid and unenforceable. The District and Contractor hereby expressly agree that the Court shall, subject to California Code of Civil Procedure §§1286.4 and 1296, vacate the award if, after review of the award, the Court determines either that the Arbitration Award is not supported by substantial evidence or that it is based on an error of law. Notwithstanding any claim or dispute arising out of this Contract or the Work, the Contractor shall continue to diligently perform the Work and prosecute the same to completion.
- **19.2 Governing Law; Interpretation**. This Contract shall be governed by the laws of the State of California. This Contract shall be interpreted as a whole and not in favor of the District or the Contractor.
- **19.3** Successors. This Contract shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the respective successors-in-interest of the District and the Contractor. The foregoing notwithstanding, the Contractor shall not assign this Contract, any right or obligation hereunder or any portion thereof.
- **19.4 Permits; Approvals**. Unless otherwise expressly provided in the Contract Documents, the Contractor shall obtain and pay for all fees, permits or approvals necessary to complete the Work.
- 19.5 Waiver of Consequential Special Damages. Notwithstanding any right conferred by law or arising by operation of law, by executing the Agreement, the Contractor expressly waives and relinquishes any and all right or entitlement to assert or recover any damages, losses or liabilities from the District which are in the nature of special or consequential damages, losses or liabilities arising out of or related in any manner to the District's breach or default of its obligations under the Contract Documents.

- **19.6 Days**. Unless otherwise stated in the Contract Documents, all references to "days" shall be deemed references to calendar days.
- 19.7 Severability. If any term, condition or provision of this Contract is deemed invalid, illegal or unenforceable by a Court of competent jurisdiction, such term, condition or provision shall be deemed severed herefrom, but all other terms, conditions and provisions hereof shall remain unaffected and in full force and effect.
- **19.8 Entire Agreement**. This Contract and the Contract Documents enumerated herein constitute the entire agreement and understanding of the District and the Contractor concerning the subject matter hereof.
