## Recommendations

- Fully implement and comply with Cal/OSHA 5141.1 emergency ruling for outdoor workers
- 2. Utilize the EPA AirNow "Current Conditions AQI" as the official AQI data for the District
- 3. Adopt the AQI Based Decision Making Matrix
- Assess current stock of N95 masks and ensure sufficient quantities to meet Cal/OSHA 5141.1





#### Recommendations

- M& O Staff to develop campus specific pre event building HVAC system inspection and operations
- Develop and update policies and procedures related to academic class cancellations due to wildfire smoke
- 7. Identify on campus facilities that could serve as temporary "cleaner air spaces/centers"



#### Recommendations

- Consider developing "pre-scripted" messages for each college community that summarize expected actions
- Investigate, purchase and install outdoor air quality monitor sensors for PM2.5 at each college
- 10. Maintain at lease one portable PM 2.5 monitor to be used for general indoor air quality investigations

- Improved process of communication and distribution of fact based information
- AQI Based Decision Making Matrix will be posted to multiple websites and reviewed each fall
- Training of all staff on masks, facial coverings and AQI levels will be key
