## Summary/Rationale:

A large percentage of summer hours targets SEPAs and immediate enrollment. With high demand, and long wait times, it is difficult to prioritize lengthy SEPC appointments over the immediate needs and urgent questions of most students.

General Counseling: Targetting an additional 100 new-student SEPCs from the Summer '24 total. 215 new student SEPCs last summer represented SEPCs for 10% of the incoming class, and we'd like to see that percentage increase to 15% for the Su/F 2025 cohort.

DSPS: Targeting double the number of SEPCs as last summer (i.e. 24). Planning targeted recruitment of New Hawk Day students who identified as DSPS.

Veterans: Additional hours this summer to target SEPCs for new students. Last summer was all SEPAs and Veterans Evaluations.

EOPS: Targeting 50% increase in SEPCs for incoming students, but with similar counseling hours. High percentage of EOPS students are continuing with existing SEPC status.

Learning Communities: Each learning communities (i.e Puente/Umoja/Movement) is adding 20 hours of counseling (early august) to do welcome counseling meetings with each incoming student in the F'25 cohort (grant funded).

## Activities & Timelines:

General Counseling: GC has scheduled 31 First Semester Planning Sessions (FSPs) across the summer including to FSP days (6/12 & 7/31) designed to serve ~100 incoming students each day.

Athletic Counseling: The athletic counselor has expanded athletic eligibility week into a two week event (7/28 - 8/11) designed to serve ~ 80 incoming student athletes.

Veterans Counseling: The Veteran's first program will continue to host ~40 incoming veterans, each with an individual counseling opportunity udring Operation Gateway (7/24 & 7/25)

## Accountability Strategies:

General Counseling: GC is exploring ways in increase drop-in efficiency, and provide clearly waittimes for students by assigning students a 15 minute drop-in slot with scheduled counselors. Its unclear if this strategy will be effective in the summer when drop-in waittimes frequently reach 2 hours.
