Las Positas College Spring 2020

Student Characteristics by Instruction Delivery Method: DE Only, Face-to-Face Only, and Mixture of DE and Face-to-Face

Observations mainly focused on DE Only students:

- * Of the 8,950 enrolled students in Spring 2020: 14% are taking only Distance Ed (DE) classes, 54% are taking only face-to-face (FtoF) classes, and 28% are taking both DE and FtoF classes.
- * Compared to other instruction delivery methods, students who take only DE classes tend to be female, from a broad range of age groups, take significantly fewer units, and from cities other than Livermore, Pleasanton, and Dublin.

Key data is highlighted below.

Implications related to FTES for Fall 2020:

- * In Spring 2020, the majority of students who take *only* DE classes take significantly fewer units. If the lower unit-load holds for DE only students, then we would need to recruit many more students (i.e., have a higher headcount), in order to reach past FTES levels.
- * Encourage students to take more units and offer more learning and support services to these students; this could increase success and retention. The increased retention could lead to FTES gains.
- *In Spring 2020, DE only students were far less likely to be male. Enhanced recruitment/marketing would increase this population.
