

### Five Year Construction Plan 2020-2024

Each year our District Facilities Planning Department is responsible for conducting a review and update of the District's Five-Year Construction Plan.

The Five-Year Construction Plan is an annual summary of current and proposed capital outlay projects. It's submitted to the State Chancellor's Office by June 30.

#### A. Submission:

- 1. Five Year Capital Outlay Plan
  - Reflects district and campus specific plans for capital outlay over the next five years.
  - Consistent with current FMP.
  - Developed on a web-based program called FUSION.

# Capacity to load ratio:

• This ratio, expressed as a percent, is the product of the computed capacity of the categorical space divided by the actual (or projected) usage.

Ratios above 100% indicate an excess of space.

Ratios below 100% indicate a deficiency of space.
