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**Las Positas College Child Development Center Now Enrolling
Low/Middle Income Students for School Readiness Program**

(Livermore, CA) - Low and middle income families are encouraged to apply for Las Positas College's (LPC) School Readiness Program. Offered through LPC's Child Development Center (CDC), the School Readiness Program offers free half day education for children aged three to five.

"We put our families at the heart of our program and strive to partner with you to support and nurture your child's individual needs, abilities, interests and culture," said CDC Director Angie Lopez.

Children will learn in a play-based learning environment with integrated academic and skill development through hands-on educational experiences. The program, Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., additionally offers free breakfast to admitted students.

Parents do not need to attend or work at LPC to enroll their children, however they must meet the income guidelines for low or moderate income or be a current federal aid recipient, homeless or in protective services to attend. All children, regardless of income, with an Individualized Education Program (IEP) automatically qualify for the program.

The program begins in August. To enroll, parents must complete the application and provide proof of current address, their child's birth certificate, a current immunization record for their child and income verification, which can be in the form of paycheck stubs, tax returns or documentation of public assistance, unemployment.
