CCMS Implementation Status

- 24 pilot colleges implemented Canvas for OEI courses
 - Full Launch Colleges 2nd Term OEI Courses (Shibboleth Upgrades)
 - Readiness/Tutoring 1st Term OEI Courses
- 53 colleges in various stages of implementing Canvas campus-wide
- 6 colleges previously using Canvas
- 59 colleges total on Canvas
