Norman:

Why I have three premium resources I really like, I am concerned about the pricing structures (whether the tiers are based on number of users or number of pages). I have heard from one IT person that he'd like us to have a hosted service, but again the pricing makes it a challenge. I find Terminal Four to be truly robust. Might be at times a bit "busy" for an end user, but also demonstrates a good degree of being intuitive. I find LiveWhale to be nicely simplistic and manageable enough for the end user and especially strong in managing and motivating news stories and the potential of a website being dynamic.

If we opted to get a number of pages platform such as Terminal Four, I would likely recommend that the Library at Chabot which has lots of content to consider upgrading to Libguides CMS, thus sparing a good number and percentage of content to a separate platform (it costs about \$3K a year and has no limits on pages so libraries can manage those environments well). (All of the web content of the Library would sit on a hosted server from Springshare and thus spare lots of memory and savings for a CMS that has a number of pages/content size platform such as Terminal Four).

Of the other premium platforms-- I found Ingeniux, CampusSuite, and Hannon Hill to be stuck in an earlier generation of which WordPress would seem more revolutionarily by comparison.

My concern of Omni Update is the tiers on the number of users, which perhaps once again, may be a good idea if the Library moves their portion to Libguides CMS as a way to save costs (though not as significantly needed as Terminal Four).
